QUESTION OF THE WEEK

On our own we cannot grasp the mystery of the resurrection. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus were "conversing and debating"; they could recount the facts but could not believe the mystery. Yet, they greatly desired to move from disappointment and unbelief to hearts burning with life and belief – they invited Jesus to stay the night with them. Our own participation in Word and sacrament must give rise to the same desire in us: to seek life by journeying deeper into the mystery.

Adult: In what way have you come to know Jesus better through the breaking of the bread at the Eucharist? Children: When you join Jesus at the table of the Eucharist next Sunday, what would you like to thank Him for?

DO YOU KNOW?

As Catholics, we prefer the crucifix over an empty cross because we see victory in the cross. It was through Jesus' suffering that we are saved. Why would we want to pretend his suffering never happened? The resurrection could not come about without the crucifixion; the two are eternally linked. For us, the crucifix is not something to idolize or something to look at in fear. It is a sorrowful reminder that our God died for our sins and then rose from the dead, opening the gates of heaven. We know that Jesus is risen, something we celebrate at every Mass, but the suffering of the crucifixion can never become a footnote to the glory of the resurrection.
