QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Matthew's Gospel this week continues the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus encourages his disciples to notice how the Father cares for even the smallest of creatures, and assures them that their heavenly Father provides even more for their needs.

Adults: What things do you worry about most frequently? How do you deal with your worry?

Children: What can help you worry less about something that might happen?

DO YOU KNOW?

"Doctor of the Church" is a title given to certain saints whose writing or preaching in theology or doctrine is outstanding for guiding the faithful in all periods of the Church's history. Four of the 35 Church Doctors are women. If you're not impressed with that number, think of it this way: Zero of the 45 presidents of the United States have been women. And one of the most recently named Doctors was a 19th century nun (Saint Therese of Lisieux), from a time when most colleges wouldn't even admit women.

Ash Wednesday is also an obligatory day of Fast and Abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. Fridays during Lent are considered days of abstinence.

Our parish will provide Soup on March 15th, together with the United Methodist Church.
