# **QUESTION OF THE WEEK**

Our greatest challenge is to be a living witness to the first beatitude. If we understand and live out being "poor in spirit," the rest falls into place. For to be "poor in spirit," we rely completely on God. We know what the present situation holds, but recognize that there is a greater glory to come in God's Kingdom.

Adult: At what times do you find it most difficult to be "poor in spirit"?

Child: Are you able to trust God completely to take care of your problems?

#### DO YOU KNOW?

Roe v Wade is the infamous case that legalized abortion in 1973. Roe's real name is Norma McCorvey. Norma, a poor and uneducated young woman, was never asked to testify in court and, like the rest of us, found out the decision of the Supreme Court from the newspaper. The case was long and by the time the decision was reached, Norma had given birth and decided that adoption was the best choice for her baby. Later, she began working in an abortion clinic that was situated next to Operation Rescue, a pro-life movement. This movement worked relentlessly to save the innocent lives of the unborn while Norma fought hard for the survival of her clinic and her cause. Through all this, the members of Operation Rescue, particularly a couple with two young girls took every opportunity to befriend Norma. The daughters would pass out literature to women who approached the abortion clinic and ask them not to go in and hurt their babies. The eight year old would always give hugs and smiles to Norma and invite her to Church. In 1995, Norma accepted the child's invitation to Church and as a result of that invitation eventually became a born again Christian. This conversion led her to the Catholic Church in 1998. Norma is now a staunch pro-life activist, working diligently to stop abortions and to have Roe v Wade overturned.
