OUESTION OF THE WEEK:

The gospel this Sunday puts before us the experience of being lost and found by God. Jesus uses not one but three images to describe for us the lengths God goes to in order to find us when we ourselves are lost. The parables also describes how God rejoices when we are found. The shepherd, the woman and the father all have in common losing, searching, finding and celebrating. Each of them had lost something that was precious to them and how happy they were when they had found it! And so it is with our heavenly Father, we may lose our way by our sin and selfishness but He patiently waits for our return so that He can rejoice that we have been found! Adult: What is holding you back from finding your way back to the Father?

Child: How can you find your way back to Jesus when you've done something wrong?
