

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

To sum up, Jesus is saying that, if we wish to be counted among the sheep, then we must be an actively loving person, irrespective of the response we get to our love. This is the way God loves us. It is not enough just to fulfill obligations, religious or otherwise, it won't do to say, "I am a good enough Catholic". We are expected to keep going out of our way and reach out in love especially to those in need – the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the poor and naked, the sick and those in prison. It does not matter how they got sick, why they are hungry, or why they are in prison. These people are especially to be loved because they are the most in need of having their lives turned around.

Adult: Who can you help turn their life around by loving and serving them?

Child: To which person did you especially try to show Jesus' love and care this past week?

DO YOU KNOW?

Next Sunday starts the New Year! The new year of the Church that is. The Feast of Christ the King ends our Liturgical Year A in which most Gospel readings come from the Book of Matthew. Next week is the first Sunday of Advent in which we begin Liturgical Year B and most Gospel readings will be from the Book of Mark. Next year will be Year C, the last of the three year cycle and readings will be from the Book of Luke. The Gospel of John is read throughout Easter, and is used for other liturgical seasons including Advent, Christmas, and Lent where appropriate.

There will be NO YOUTH GROUP MEETINGS in the month of December. We will resume meeting on January 7.

An IRA charitable rollover is a very simple gift to make. Please make your gift as soon as possible to avoid any processing delays at the end of the year. For more information about how you and the Church can benefit from an IRA charitable rollover, contact your IRA administrator, tax preparer, or the parish office for more information.

In addition, if you want to simplify your weekly offering to OLBS, consider using your bank's online bill-paying system to make your regular and special donations to OLBS. Be sure to include your parish envelope number as the account number or in the memo line so that your contribution is recorded correctly. When you set up this recurring payment, you can relax and know that your support is strong, even when you're away or not able to attend Mass. Thank You!
