

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

A day goes by and before we know it we are falling into bed exhausted. We intended to take time to pray, but time got away from us. In today's Gospel Jesus teaches us by example that it is important to take time to be alone to pray. From prayer we can draw strength to do what each day requires, most especially by showing our family in word and by deed what it means to be a disciple of Jesus, a child of God.

Adult: What can I do to be better prepared to proclaim the Good News with conviction?

Child: How can I share my faith and trust in Jesus with my friends?

DO YOU KNOW?

We believe that at each celebration of the Mass, bread and wine are truly transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Therefore, Jesus comes to be present with us not only spiritually, but physically. In the Eucharist, Jesus is just as present with us in the bread and wine as He was 2000 years ago when He walked the earth. In Eucharistic Adoration, the Eucharistic Host (the Body of Jesus) is placed in a gold monstrance to be adored. "Monstrance" is from Latin, meaning 'to show'. Therefore we use the monstrance to show Jesus to those who come to adore. Join us on the first Saturday of every month at 4:30 pm for Eucharistic Adoration followed by Benediction at about 5:10 pm, followed by the 5:30 pm Saturday Mass.

For those who need healing from the trauma of an abortion, a Rachel's Vineyard Retreat, sponsored by Church of the Epiphany, will be held March 9-11, 2018. The Diocese of Richmond did away with the collection for the Campaign for Human Development amid some concerns that transparency was insufficient to ensure the funds were being used as planned. At the time they made this decision, it was too late to remove the envelopes from our mailings. As a result, some parishioners turned in their envelopes with donations. Four hundred seven dollars was collected. Our Parish Finance Council voted to deposit these funds into the Haiti account as the cause that most closely matches the original intention of the collection. In the interest of comprehensibility, the Finance Council thought it was important to let our parishioners know where this collection will be used.
