DO YOU KNOW

For much of the nineteenth century Catholics in America were the unassimilated, sometimes violent "religious other." Often they did not speak English or attend public schools. Some of their religious women – nuns – wore distinctive clothing. Their religious practices and beliefs – from rosaries to transubstantiation – seemed to many Americans superstitious nonsense. As the immigration pattern in the nineteenth century changed and more and more immigrants arrived ashore from countries other than England, the number of Catholics increased dramatically. Their arrival was met with suspicions and xenophobia. In the 1840s and 1850s these anxieties about Catholicism in American society turned violent, resulting in mob attacks on priests and churches as well as the formation of a major political party, the Know Nothings (aka The American Party) dedicated to combating Catholic influence.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

The Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist is indeed a mystery of faith. In a world where answers to questions and explanations of how things work can be researched in an instant, it can be difficult to sit with such a mystery. Jesus becoming man, raising the dead, healing the sick, multiplying loaves and fish and rising from the dead are all "mysteries" in that we don't understand how He did these things but because eyewitnesses have recorded this in Scripture, we believe. And yet, we stumble with the mystery of the Real Presence, also recorded by eyewitnesses in Scripture. Jesus himself stresses He is the Bread of Life and unless we eat of his flesh and drink of his blood we won't have eternal life. If Jesus tells us this, then who are we not to believe it?

Adult: How does the hope of eternal life shape the way you live your life?

Child: What mysteries of our faith do you find hard to believe?
