DO YOU KNOW

What is the significance of the gifts of the Magi? Gold, frankincense and myrrh are not typically gifts for a newborn, but Jesus wasn't the typical newborn. Scholars generally agree that the gift of gold represented Jesus as a king with an everlasting throne. It was a treasure befitting royalty, albeit royalty in the home of a young, poor family. Frankincense was used in the temple routines, burned ceremonially by the priests. The gift of frankincense is said to have been an acknowledgement of Jesus' priesthood, setting him apart from a typical king. Myrrh was used as an embalming spice so this gift foretold of Jesus' death.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

As we look upon the crib, we cannot stay there. Like the shepherds and the magi, we too are called to move away and take the light of Jesus with us. We are asked not only to admire the light, but to be people of light. As Jesus himself tells us, 'you are the light of the world and your light must shine.' The light of the Epiphany is given to us as a gift, but we cannot keep it to or for ourselves. Through the quality of our daily lives and how we treat each other, we are called to make our families, homes, parish communities and the wider world a better and brighter place for all people, especially the poor and the marginalized.

Adults: What am I doing to bring others into the light of Christ? Child: Who are the people that have guided you in your relationship with Jesus?
