## DO YOU KNOW?

Catechumens are unbaptized persons who desire to be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Candidates are those who have been baptized in the Christian faith and are seeking full communion in the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. Proof of valid baptism in a recognized Christian denomination (by way of a certificate of baptism or letter of verification from one's pastor or church of baptism) is required of all candidates.

## **QUESTION OF THE WEEK**

The people of Jesus' time often thought, wrongly, that misfortunes of any kind, such as accidents or ill health, were signs of sinfulness in the unfortunate person or persons. Jesus points out that this was not the case. Those who are not careful about their relationship with God are in greater danger. He gives an example of a fig tree that is in full foliage with all the appearance of being healthy, but it does not bear fruit. The owner orders it to be cut down for not fulfilling its intended purpose. However, the gardener asks for more time to work with it hoping that it will respond. Lent is like that "more time" for us to respond to God's call to repent so that we can fulfill our intended purpose. Adults: Are you taking time to be with God in prayer during this Lenten season so that you can produce good fruit? Children: Are you taking a little more time to pray during Lent?
