DO YOU KNOW?

The Easter Vigil is generally seen as the most important service of the year, particularly in Catholic and Orthodox Churches. There were traces of the Vigil already in the second century. It was always a night of vigil, in remembrance and expectation of Jesus Christ's resurrection. To it was soon added the reception of the sacraments of Christian initiation: baptism, confirmation and the Eucharist, so that it became in turn the great sacramental night of the Church. It begins at sunset with the Service of Light, which at our parish begins on the front steps with a blazing fire. The new Paschal candle is blessed and lit and then we light our candles and process into a dark church. We listen to the readings of our salvation story and suddenly the lights come on and we once again sing the Gloria and say Alleluia!, which have been silent since Ash Wednesday. We continue with the Liturgy of the Word and the blessing of the new baptismal water followed by the baptism and confirmation of our catechumen. Mass continues with the Liturgy of the Eucharist and the newly baptized will join us for the first time at the table of the Lord.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

How quickly the crowd changed and turned on Jesus. The same people who were happy to welcome him with shouts of joy, will soon begin to shout 'Crucify him, Crucify him.' Jesus is even betrayed and denied by his closest friends. The rest of them run and desert him. He is left alone.

After the food was blessed it was taken home and eaten as the breakfast meal on Easter Sunday, thus "breaking the fast". This Catholic ritual which has been cherished for centuries was brought to our parish by Polish families. It has now been adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds who enjoy this richly symbolic custom. If you would like to participate in this tradition bring your basket of food to the Church at 11:30 am on Holy Saturday.
