## DO YOU KNOW?

It might come as a surprise to many that the largest Catholic parish community in the world is found in Dubai in the United Arab Emirates. Although Dubai is a Muslim city and emirate, Christians may openly practice their faith and also wear crosses in public. When Catholics applied to build the church of St Mary's in Dubai in the 1960s, the then ruler, Sheikh Rashid Bin Saeed Al Matoum, immediately gave permission. Not only that-he personally laid the church's foundation stone. On Sundays, seven Masses in various different languages are held at St Mary's, which is in the center of Dubai. The church is served by seven priests and holds around 2,000 worshipers. The church is full to overflowing at each Mass with people often having to stand in the doorway. The Dubai Catholic community also has a second church, St Francis. Fr Reinhold Sahner is the parish priest at St Francis. He has four assistant priests to help him look after his rapidly growing parish. Fr Sahner said he usually baptizes an average of five children each week and conducts 50 marriages a year at St Francis. There are 35 different Christian churches in the UAE. Most of them have been built on land donated by the country's ruling families.
