DO YOU KNOW?

Per the Catechism, just War doctrine gives certain conditions for the legitimate exercise of force, all of which must be met:

- 1. the damage inflicted by the aggressor on the nation or community of nations must be lasting, grave, and certain;
- 2. all other means of putting an end to it must have been shown to be impractical or ineffective;
- 3. there must be serious prospects of success;
- 4. the use of arms must not produce evils and disorders graver than the evil to be eliminated. The power of modern means of destruction weighs very heavily in evaluating this condition [CCC 2309].

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

When we think of peace we usually consider the cessation of hostilities between warring nations, or even warring members of a family. That is not the peace the Lord gives. The peace of the Lord is the joy we experience when we are united to Him. This is the peace that Jesus felt on the cross when He was united to His Father while His Sacred Body was being tortured to death. This is the peace that the martyrs felt when others brutalized them for refusing to give up Jesus Christ. This is the peace that we all feel when we are mocked for taking our faith, our commitment to the Lord, so seriously that we refuse to join in with the immorality of our particular societies, be that at school, in the neighborhood, or even within the country. Adult: What keeps you from experiencing the peace of being totally united to Christ? Child: What can you do to be more peaceful in your life?
