DO YOU KNOW?

There is still a stereotype that Mass is antiquated, or ritualistic. However, interestingly, much of the content of Mass is based on the book of Revelation. For example, each Mass we sing the "Holy, Holy, Holy" which is straight out of Revelation 4:8. The idea is we are joining in with those in Heaven in their unending hymn of praise. So that's a real profound moment, if you think about joining in singing the same song those in Heaven are singing, and the connection between the physical and th4 spiritual that is occurring. And that's just one tiny example. You can do an entire study on Revelation and the Mass. The more you know, the more amazing Mass becomes.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

The Lord's Prayer begins by focusing on God, His nature, and His work in the world. This teaches us that our prayers should focus first on God, through praising and thanking Him. Only then, do we turn to our requests. "Give us this day our daily bread" is a petition for God to provider for us both materially (e.g. food, shelter, clothing, etc.) and spiritually (e.g. the nourishment for our souls we receive from the bread of life, the Eucharist). God wants to provide for our needs. We can have assurance that when we ask, He will answer. Even if we don't get what we want, the answer will be better than what we asked for, because God is a good gift giver. In fact, the ultimate and best gift He gives us is Himself, for we hear that the Father will "give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him." Therefore, we should persist in petitioning God. And we should strive to conform our requests to the sill of God. Finally, our prayers should include confessing our sins to the Lord and asking for forgiveness. If we have committed a serious, mortal sin we need to go to Confession, too. But daily prayer should include acknowledging our sins and asking for forgiveness, along with seeking to forgive those who have sinned against us.

Adults: Have your most recent prayers been prayers of praise, petition, or sorrow? Which kind of prayer do you need to practice more often?

Children: What are you most thankful for right now?

Knestout announces the implementation of a hotline that will be used to report concerns of suspected financial, administrative or human resource misconduct within the Diocese of Richmond. The hotline will be handled by an independent, third-party reporting system, EthicsPoint, to ensure accountability and transparency with reporting procedures. The use of such a hotline is another safeguard to protect the resources entrusted to us by the people of our diocese. Reports can be made online or by phone. Employees, volunteers, clergy, parishioners and any other individual wishing to report can do so anonymously, if they wish. The toll-free number is 844-739-3210 and is offered in multiple languages. To submit a report online, please visit the diocesan website, www.richmonddiocese.org and select "EthicsPoint." The hotline number is not a 911 or emergency service number. Individuals should not use this number to report information that is of an immediate threat to life or property. Additionally, EthicsPoint is NOT intended to receive information about sexual abuse allegations. Abuse allegations should be reported immediately to local law enforcement and th4 Attorney General's Clergy Abuse Hotline at 1-833-454-9064. Additional information including a video message and letter from Bishop Knestout, a list of frequently asked questions and other resources regarding EthicsPoint can be found by visiting the diocesan website.

If you are a senior citizen or a disabled citizen or know someone who may benefit from wellness checks, please consider enrolling yourself or them in our S.A.F.E. (Secure and Friendly Environment) Program. The concept is simple: by filling out a confidential guestionnaire, you/they will receive a daily telephone call from a representative of the Police Department to check on your/their welfare. If the department is unable to contact you/them by phone, an officer will reach out to family members, neighbors, or others listed on the questionnaire to check on that person. Emergency personnel also may be dispatched as needed. S.A.F.E. offers an extra level of care for citizens who may experience accidental falls, medical emergencies, or need assistance during severe weather events. This is a FREE service to anyone who lives in the Town of West Point. To request the application, please call the West Point Police Department at their nonemergency number, 804-843-2800. An officer will deliver the application to your address and assist you in filling it out, if help is needed. The information you share with S.A.F.E. will be held in strict confidentiality. S.A.F.E. is designed to assist citizens who wish to live both independently and confidently. You/they are free to withdraw from the program whenever you choose. (The Town of West Point offers no expressed liability for the failure of the program through emergency demands, personnel availability, or hum an error.)
