DO YOU KNOW?

The purpose of the Church is to make disciples of Jesus. Too many people have a false understanding of the purpose of the Catholic Church. After Jesus made the Church, He gave a clear mission statement to His apostles: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." -Matt 38:19-20. Everything else the Church does, feed the hungry, perpetuate the Sacraments, etc. is in service to this mission. Evangelization isn't optional. Each of us, as baptized Christians, need to spread God's love through our works of service - not just to those we are comfortable helping but those who are on the margins of society.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK Humility, true humility, is not hovering in a corner and falsely putting ourselves down.

True humility is based on honesty – acknowledging who we are in God's sight and how the Lord Jesus has blessed us. It also requires that we have the same attitude that

Jesus demonstrated by His compassion and His reaching out to those who truly needed to

hear from His actions the Good News which He preached. To put it succinctly, humility is not just thinking less of ourselves but rather thinking of ourselves less and, thus, thinking of others more.

Children: What can you do to help others whose needs are bigger than yours?

Employees, volunteers, clergy, parishioners and any other individual wishing to report can do so anonymously, if they wish. The toll-free number is 844-739-3210 and is offered in multiple languages. To submit a report online, please visit the diocesan website, www.richmonddiocese.org and select "EthicsPoint." The hotline number is not a 911 or emergency service number. Individuals should not use this number to report information that is of an immediate threat to life or property. Additionally, EthicsPoint is NOT intended to receive information about sexual abuse allegations. Abuse allegations should be reported immediately to local law enforcement and th4 Attorney General's Clergy Abuse Hotline at 1-833-454-9064.
