DO YOU KNOW?

Did you ever wish that you had a "pause" button for life? You know, the ability to pause the really important moments so that you could more fully enjoy them? In a way, the Eucharistic Adoration is a "pause button" for the moment in Mass when the priest elevates the Host, Body of Christ. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a form of prayer that began centuries ago. The same Eucharist we receive at Mass is what (or more accurately Who) we worship in Adoration. A consecrated Host is displayed in a beautiful sacred vessel called a Monstrance. The word "monstrance" means "to show". The Monstrance allows Christ's body to be seen and "shown" to us - so that we can be present to God as He is present to us in His Eucharist. It is very important to remember that Adoration can be a time for us to just sit and relax and enjoy sweet peace that comes from simply being in the presence of God. It can be a time to read from the Sacred Scriptures, pray the Rosary or use any other form or prayer we so desire. We can spend as much time as we desire praying in this way. You may feel that you can't pray well. Don't let this discourage you. The mere fact that you take time out to spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament pleases Him very much and is in itself a prayer of great faith.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

The point Jesus wanted to make with today's parable is that we should be wise in our use of our worldly goods, because if they are used selfishly, they will fail us. However, if we share our resources with others, true wealth will await us in the Kingdom. The final point of Jesus' words is that we cannot serve two masters, God and money. Selfish use of our resources moves us away from God and all that He has in store for us. Our purpose is to share what we have been given with others.

Adults: Money is an important part of modern life. Suggest one or two ways you can keep the need for money in balance with your faith.

Children: Clothes, food, toys all cost money.

How do you keep your faith more important than

money?
