#### **DO YOU KNOW?**

When we enter into the Mass, we are no longer functioning on an earthly level. The Church uses "Heavenly" language in the Mass because it is set apart from earthly realities.

The Mass isn't just about Jesus coming to earth as much as it is God lifting us up into Heaven for an hour. One of the major prayers that contains elements directly derived from the Bible is the Sanctus. The threefold acclamation of God's holiness - holy, holy, holy - is found in both the Old and New Testaments. In the Old Testament, the prophet Isaiah describes his vision of the heavenly throne room and how within it he sees and hears angels singing, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts" (IS 6:3).

Similarly, St. John sees the same thing when he is given access to the heavenly throne room of the Lamb. He writes in Revelation 4:8, "And the four living creatures...day and night...never cease to sing, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!" Perhaps this makes sense out of the preface before the prayer of the Sanctus: "And so, with the angels and archangels, with thrones and dominions, and with all the hosts and powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim." The Sanctus is thus a sign to the Catholic faithful that they are sacramentally entering into the heavenly sanctuary to join their voices with the heavenly beings.

## QUESTION OF THE WEEK

In today's Gospel Jesus does not tell us that we should have no love for the things most precious in our lives, our many bonds of kinship, even our own life itself. He is telling us that even these things must not be given a preference in our decisions that would amount to a renunciation of Christ and what He stands for. If we are to be His true followers, we must 'carry His cross and come after Him.' Our following must not be half-hearted, His two parables tell us. We must weigh up fully the implications of our decision not to allow any consideration to destroy our commitment to Him; we must be ready to carry it through to the end. The final words of the Gospel are the most challenging of all: 'none of you can be my disciples unless he gives up all his possessions'. But these very words help us to understand that Jesus is not holding up to us an impossible ideal. We are urged to 'lend, without hope of return' and to 'give' generously. What the Lord asks for is that in our life commitments, we place all that is most dear to us in His hands, ready to accept whatever He asks of us.

Adults: Who or what problem do you need to place in God's hands and trust in Him?

Children: What are you worried about that you should trust God to take care of?

Mother Teresa of Calcutta has been declared a saint by the Catholic Church. Back in 1994, she spoke at the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, DC, and said the following words:

*I feel that the greatest destroyer of peace today is abortion, because it is a war against the child, a direct killing of the innocent child, murder by the mother herself. And if we accept that a mother can kill even her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another? How do we persuade a woman not to have an abortion? As always, we must persuade her with love, and we remind ourselves that love means to be willing to give until it hurts. Jesus gave even His life to love us. So, the mother who is thinking of abortion, should be helped to love, that is, to give until it hurts her plans, or her free time, to respect the life of her child. The father of that child, whoever he is, must also give until it hurts. By abortion, the mother does not learn to love, but kills even her own child to solve her problems. And, by abortion, the father is told that he does not have to take any responsibility at all for the child he has brought into the world. That father is likely to put other women into the same trouble. So, abortion just leads to more abortion. Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love, but to use any violence to get what they want. This is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion. Knestout announces the implementation of a hotline that will be used to report concerns of suspected financial, administrative or human resource misconduct within the Diocese of Richmond. The hotline will be handled by an independent, third-party reporting system, EthicsPoint, to ensure accountability and transparency with reporting procedures. The use of such a hotline is another safeguard to protect the resources entrusted to us by the people of our diocese. Reports can be made online or by phone. Employees, volunteers, clergy, parishioners and any other individual wishing to report can do so anonymously, if they wish. The toll-free number is 844-739-3210 and is offered in multiple languages. To submit a report online, please visit the diocesan website, [www.richmonddiocese.org](http://www.richmonddiocese.org) and select "EthicsPoint." The hotline number is not a 911 or emergency service number. Individuals should not use this number to report information that is of an immediate threat to life or property. Additionally, EthicsPoint is NOT intended to receive information about sexual abuse allegations. Abuse allegations should be reported immediately to local law enforcement and the Attorney General's Clergy Abuse Hotline at 1-833-454-9064.
