## SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Damien of Molokai was known as "the leper priest". At age 23, he traveled to Hawaii as a missionary where he was ordained. Saint Damien volunteered to live among the leper colony of Molokai and minister to those who were sick and outcast. His outreach to lepers gained notice, eventually bringing vital medical attention to those with the deadly, contagious disease. Saint Damien contracted leprosy and died in 1889. Fr. Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11<sup>th</sup>, 2009. The Catholic Encyclopedia calls him "the Apostle of the Lepers", and elsewhere he is known as the "leper priest". His feast day is April 15<sup>th</sup>.

### DO YOU KNOW?

The mysteries of the Rosary were introduced by Dominic of Prussia sometime between 1410 and 1439. This gave each decade of the Rosary a unique quality. Each mystery leads us to ponder very specific events in the lives of Jesus and Mary and the lessons they hold for our own lives today. There were originally three sets of mysteries: The Joyful Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries, and the Glorious Mysteries. On October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2002, almost 600 years after the original Mysteries of the Rosary were established, Pope John Paul II proposed adding a new set of mysteries called the Luminous Mysteries (the Mysteries of Light) which focus on Jesus' public ministry. He wrote that "The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christ-centered prayer. It has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety. It is an echo of the prayer of Mary, her perennial Magnificat for the work of the redemptive incarnation which began in her virginal womb."

## QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Today's leprosy is not a medical condition or a legal status. It is, rather, a spiritual condition. It is leprosy of the heart. Its symptoms have nothing to do with our skin. Instead they are things like perfectionism, gluttony, sadness, anger, pride, boredom, gossip, the need to control or of approval, fear, being judgmental, restlessness, excessive busyness, grudges, prejudice, jealousy, condemnation, indifference, addiction. It distorts how we see and relate to God, the world, others, and even ourselves. It is our spirits that need cleansing so that we can experience the fullness of life in this world and the next.

**Children:** What are some habits you need to break so that you can feel spiritually clean?

**\*\*\*The Registration Deadline for voting in the General Election is Monday, October 15<sup>th</sup>.**

The Diocese of Richmond urges individuals who have been sexually abused by a priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese to report abuse directly to law enforcement, including Child Protective Services (CPS) at 1-800-552-7096, and by calling the Attorney General's Clergy Abuse Hotline at 1-833-454-9064. Individuals are encouraged to contact the 24-hour confidential Victim's Assistance Reporting number at 1-877-887-9603 or email [vac@richmonddiocese.org](mailto:vac@richmonddiocese.org) to report sexual abuse.

A popular scam targeting parishioners is making the rounds yet again. Criminals set up fraudulent email addresses, with similar spellings on yahoo, gmail, etc. and send messages that APPEAR to be coming from the pastor. They are trying trick people into sending gift cards to the pastor via links in the email (most popularly iTunes gift cards). This scam has become common enough that Apple has placed a warning on their site, as well. Please NEVER transfer funds or send gift cards to people requesting it online. ALWAYS check with your parish office first.



FROM THE OFFICE OF BISHOP KNESTOUT: "Christian Stewardship calls us to utilize the resources of the diocese with integrity." Bishop Barry C. Knestout announces the implementation of a hotline that will be used to report concerns of suspected financial, administrative or human resource misconduct within the Diocese of Richmond. The hotline will be handled by an independent, third-party reporting system, EthicsPoint, to ensure accountability and transparency with reporting procedures. The use of such a hotline is another safeguard to protect the resources entrusted to us by the people of our diocese. Reports can be made online or by phone. Employees, volunteers, clergy, parishioners and any other individual wishing to report can do so anonymously, if they wish. The toll-free number is 844-739-3210 and is offered in multiple languages. To submit a report online, please visit the diocesan website, [www.richmonddiocese.org](http://www.richmonddiocese.org) and select "EthicsPoint." The hotline number is not a 911 or emergency service number. Individuals should not use this number to report information that is of an immediate threat to life or property. Additionally, EthicsPoint is NOT intended to receive information about sexual abuse allegations. Abuse allegations should be reported immediately to local law enforcement and the Attorney General's Clergy Abuse Hotline at 1-833-454-9064. Additional information including a video message and letter from Bishop Knestout, a list of frequently asked questions and other resources regarding EthicsPoint can be found by visiting the diocesan website.
