SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Raphael is one of the seven Archangels who stand before the throne of the Lord, and one of the only three mentioned by name in the Bible. He appears, by name, only in the Book of Tobit. Raphael's name means "God heals". This identity came about because of the biblical story that claims he "healed" the earth when it was defiled by the sins of the fallen angels in the apocryphal Book of Enoch. St. Raphael is the patron saint of travelers, the blind, bodily ills, happy meetings, nurses, physicians and medical workers. He is often pictured holding a staff and either holding or standing on a fish. His individual feast day is October 24th but is liturgically celebrated on September 29th, along with St. Michael and St. Gabriel.

DO YOU KNOW?

Many complain that they have no time to pray and, much less, time to pray the Holy Rosary. Priorities! In the time of one soap-opera or prime-time drama (60 minutes) four Rosaries could be prayed, 15 minutes apiece. Let us put Jesus, Mary and prayer in the center of our lives!

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Praying "always" may seem like an impossible task. Is it really possible to do so? Does God even expect this of us? It most certainly is and He most certainly does. No, we will not be called to spend all day, every day, at church in prayer. Not even those called to the cloistered monastic life do as
