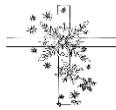

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Trung Van Tran, of Phan-Xa, Vietnam, joined the army in 1825 and was imprisoned after being accused of cheating during a scholastic exam. When the Vietnamese emperor Tu Duc granted a general amnesty to prisoners, all were ordered to trample upon a cross in renunciation of Christianity if they wanted to be set free. Having converted to the Catholic faith, Francis refused to comply with this command. When questioned about this he said, "Never will I desert my religion". He was beaten repeatedly and sentenced to death for his faith. At his execution, Francis asked for a bit of limestone paste, which he then used to draw a cross upon the back of his neck. He was put to death by beheading. He was canonized in 1988 and his feast day is October 6<sup>th</sup>.

#### DO YOU KNOW?

In 1572 Pope St. Pius V established the Feast of the Holy Rosary on October 7<sup>th</sup>, and in 1883 Pope Leo XIII officially dedicated the month of October to the Holy Rosary. The word Rosary means "Crown of Roses". Our Lady has revealed to several people that each time they say a Hail Mary they are giving her a beautiful rose and that each complete Rosary makes her a crown of roses. In every apparition, the Heavenly Mother has invited us to say the Rosary as a powerful weapon against evil, to bring us to true peace. Our prayer made together with our Heavenly Mother can obtain the great gift of bringing about a change of hearts and conversion.

A popular scam targeting parishioners is making the rounds yet again. Criminals set up fraudulent email addresses, with similar spellings on yahoo, gmail, etc. and send messages that APPEAR to be coming from the pastor. They are trying trick people into sending gift cards to the pastor via links in the email (most popularly iTunes gift cards). This scam has become common enough that Apple has placed a warning on their site, as well. Please NEVER transfer funds or send gift cards to people requesting it online. ALWAYS check with your parish office first.

FROM THE OFFICE OF BISHOP KNESTOUT: "Christian Stewardship calls us to utilize the resources of the diocese with integrity." Bishop Barry C. Knestout announces the implementation of a hotline that will be used to report concerns of suspected financial, administrative or human resource misconduct within the Diocese of Richmond. The hotline will be handled by an independent, third-party reporting system, EthicsPoint, to ensure accountability and transparency with reporting procedures. The use of such a hotline is another safeguard to protect the resources entrusted to us by the people of our diocese. Reports can be made online or by phone. Employees, volunteers, clergy, parishioners and any other individual wishing to report can do so anonymously, if they wish. The toll-free number is 844-739-3210 and is offered in multiple languages. To submit a report online, please visit the diocesan website, [www.richmonddiocese.org](http://www.richmonddiocese.org) and select "EthicsPoint." The hotline number is not a 911 or emergency service number. Individuals should not use this number to report information that is of an immediate threat to life or property. Additionally, EthicsPoint is NOT intended to receive information about sexual abuse allegations. Abuse allegations should be reported immediately to local law enforcement and the Attorney General's Clergy Abuse Hotline at 1-833-454-9064. Additional information including a video message and letter from Bishop Knestout, a list of frequently asked questions and other resources regarding EthicsPoint can be found by visiting the diocesan website.
