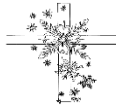

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Pope Leo the Great was deeply dedicated to his service as pope. He saw himself as privileged to sit in the Chair of St. Peter, as the servant of the servants of God. He worked diligently as "Peter's successor". Over time, Leo became known as one of the best administrative popes of the ancient Church. Pope Leo I focused his pontificate on four main areas. He continuously worked to oppose and root out numerous heresies which were threatening the Western Church. Among them were Pelagianism, which involved denying Original Sin and failing to understand the necessity of God's grace for salvation. At the foundation of the Pelagian error was the mistaken notion that we can perfect ourselves without God's grace and assistance. He is the first pope to be given the title 'Great'. His feast day is November 10.

#### DO YOU KNOW?

According to the Catechism (#1911), *Common Good* is human interdependence or the unity of the human family. The Church, as explained in *Gadium et Spes*, calls on all nations to work together to provide for various needs of people around the world by providing food, shelter, and education or by alleviating the suffering of refugees and migrants. The Church teaches that every person should voluntarily participate in promoting the common good, depending on position and vocation. We do this first and foremost by taking "personal responsibility" which includes caring for our family and dedicating ourselves to our work. Then we move our involvement outward so that we participate in "public life" as fully as possible.

#### QUESTION OF THE WEEK

As we enter into the final weeks of the church year, our attention is being drawn to the second coming of Christ and the themes of the "Last Things": death, judgment, Heaven, and hell. And this Sunday's Gospel is an invitation for us to reflect on the promise of a resurrected life offered us by Jesus: our perfect union with God and the fullness of life forever. We can be confident that what we experience here in grace will reach its fulfillment in the life to come.

Adults: How do you answer when someone asks about your view of after life?

Children: What do you think Heaven will be like?

The hotline will be handled by an independent, third-party reporting system, EthicsPoint, to ensure accountability and transparency with reporting procedures. The use of such a hotline is another safeguard to protect the resources entrusted to us by the people of our diocese. Reports can be made online or by phone. Employees, volunteers, clergy, parishioners and any other individual wishing to report can do so anonymously, if they wish. The toll-free number is 844-739-3210 and is offered in multiple languages. To submit a report online, please visit the diocesan website, [www.richmonddiocese.org](http://www.richmonddiocese.org) and select "EthicsPoint." The hotline number is not a 911 or emergency service number. Individuals should not use this number to report information that is of an immediate threat to life or property. Additionally, EthicsPoint is NOT intended to receive information about sexual abuse allegations. Abuse allegations should be reported immediately to local law enforcement and the Attorney General's Clergy Abuse Hotline at 1-833-454-9064.
