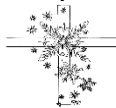

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

John of Kanty was born in a small town in Poland on June 23, 1390. He attended the University of Krakow. After brilliant studies he was ordained a priest and became a professor of theology. His popularity caused him to be ousted by rivals and sent to be a parish priest at Olkusz. An extremely humble man, he did his best, but his best was not to the liking of his parishioners. Besides, he was afraid of the responsibilities of his position. But in the end he won his people's hearts with kindness and love. After some time he returned to Krakow to teach scripture. John was a serious man, and humble, but known to all the poor of Krakow for his kindness. His goods and his money were always at their disposal, and time and again they took advantage of him. He kept only the money and clothes absolutely needed to support himself. He slept little, ate sparingly, and took no meat. He made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, hoping to be martyred by the Turks. Later John made four subsequent pilgrimages to Rome, carrying his luggage on his back. He died on December 24, 1473. He is the patron Saint of teachers, students, priests, and pilgrims. Because of the liturgical celebrations of Christmas, his feast day has been moved to December 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Catholic Cemetery in New Kent is names for St. John Kanti.

## DO YOU KNOW?

Bethlehem means "house of bread"! In Hebrew, Beth-lehem is two words and means "house" (Beth as in Beth-el, "house of God") and "bread" (lehem). How fitting that Jesus was born in Bethlehem and rested in a feeding trough so that He could become our Bread of Life.

## QUESTION OF THE WEEK

We all struggle with the choices of this world – whether we orient ourselves to the temporal and material, or whether we put the Lord first at the center of our hearts and our lives. We put ourselves on the path of destruction by paying homage to the material and the temporal, craving those to the extent that we shut out the Lord from our hearts and lives. He calls us constantly, but we often stop listening, and eventually stop being able to recognize His call.

Joseph and Mary show how we should orient ourselves to the Lord. In today's Gospel passage, Joseph opens his heart to the Lord and restores his house by bringing Mary into his home and also restoring the Davidic line.

When the Lord calls us, what will be our choice? Do we choose sin to reconcile us to the world, or choose Christ to reconcile us to God? When He comes to us, will we rejoice – or pretend we heard nothing? Adults: How can you prepare your heart to hear God's call?

Children: How can you prepare to make the right choices?
