

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Katherine Drexel was born into a wealthy family that practiced the faith by prayer and good works. After taking a trip to the western part of the United States, she saw the poor conditions Native Americans were living in and vowed to do something to make a difference. She went on to found and staff schools for both Native Americans and Afro-Americans throughout the country. During her lifetime, she opened, staffed and directly supported nearly 60schools and missions, especially in the West and Southwest United States. Her crowning educational focus was the establishment in 1925 of Xavier University of Louisiana, the only predominantly Afro-American Catholic institution of higher learning in the United States. Her congregation of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament continue her work today. St. Katherine Drexel is the second Americanborn saint to be canonized by the Catholic

DO YOU KNOW?

Why is Lent 40 days? The number 40 is a significant number for Christians. Jesus spent 40 days in a desert. Noah had to wait 40 days for his ark to float. And, Moses, along with his followers, traveled through the wilderness for 40 years before reaching the Promised Land. Ezekiel laid on his right side for 40 days to "bear the iniquity" of Judea's sins. Saul, David, and Solomon reigned for 40 years each. Jonah warned Nineveh they

had 40 days to repent. However, if you count the days between Ash Wednesday and Holy Saturday, you will find more than 40. That is due to the fact the Church doesn't consider Sundays as a time of penitence as Sundays are always a celebration of the Lord's Resurrection.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Like Jesus did in today's Gospel, we need to confront and conquer temptations, using the means He employed: Like Jesus, every one of us is tempted to seek sinful pleasures, easy wealth and positions of authority, and is drawn to the

use of unjust or sinful means to attain good ends. Jesus sets a model for conquering temptations through prayer, penance, and the

effective use of the "Word of God". Temptations make us true warriors of God by strengthening our minds and hearts. We are never tempted beyond the strength God gives us. Lent is our own 40 days in the desert to strengthen our spiritual selves with prayer,

fasting, and almsgiving so that we can better resist the temptation the evil one is sure to thrust upon us.

Adults: What is your plan for spiritual strengthening this Lent?

Children: What helps you do the right thing when you want to do something wrong?

<u>YOU SHALL BE LIKE GODS</u> This original temptation, outlined in the first reading, was a promise that what was right and what was wrong would be up to us; that we could write our own moral law. That's what the "tree of the knowledge of good and evil" meant, and why Adam and Eve couldn't eat from it. We are all called to know good from evil, but not to decide it. To think we decide it is the error of the "prochoice" mindset. "It's all up to me and my choice, even if it means killing a baby." In the culture of life, on the other hand, we live in the freedom of the children of God and pattern our lives on the obedience of Jesus that leads to life eternal. (Priests for Life)

The story is set in a time when it was common for the faith's Japanese adherents to hide from persecution that resulted from the suppression of Christianity in Japan during the Shimabara Rebellion (1637-1638) against Tokugawa shogunate. DIOCESE OF RICHMOND THE THIRD BISHOP

FATHER JOHN McGILL

Father John McGill was appointed the Richmond Diocese's third bishop in 1850. Before coming to Richmond, Bishop McGill was a priest in the Louisville, Kentucky Diocese. As bishop of Richmond, Bishop McGill was responsible for 7,000 Catholics, ten churches and eight priests. During his tenure, Bishop McGill and the Diocese faced many difficulties: the anti-Catholic "Know Nothing" movement, Tidewater's yellow fever epidemic, and the Civil War.

The "Know Nothing" movement was an anti-Catholic, anti-immigrant society. When its members were questioned about the secret society, they were instructed to reply, "I know nothing," hence, the name of the party.

In the summer of 1855, yellow fever swept through Portsmouth and Norfolk and claimed 3,000 lives. Ann Behan Plume Herron used her home to nurse slaves. She later donated her house to the Daughters of Charity, and this became the first Catholic hospital in the Richmond Diocese. It later became the Hospital of St. Vincent DePaul. During the Civil War, Bishop McGill was a supporter of the southern cause. He did not think that slavery was a grave sin. As early as the 15th century, popes had condemned slavery; but their declarations fell on deaf ears.

After the Civil War, the borders of the Richmond Diocese changed. The Vatican I Council was convened. Bishop McGill was in attendance; but due to ill health, he left before the Council was ended. Bishop McGill died in 1872.
