

QUESTION OF THE WEEK The Transfiguration teaches us that we are

meant to see the Vision of God. Unlike the apostles, we do not know Jesus face to face. How, then, do we get a glimpse of Him in all His glory? The central and most important way is in the Mass. At every Eucharist, the Risen Lord is truly present in our midst. When the readings are proclaimed, it is Jesus' voice we hear. When we receive the Eucharist, we touch the body of the Risen Lord just as the apostles did, and we are transformed by Him. For that reason, the Sunday Mass is an indispensable part of our Christian life and spirituality. While it is very good to read the bible, pray the rosary and contemplate the beauty of nature, none of these activities can compare with the Gift offered in the Eucharist. While those activities can give us some insight into Jesus and His love, they cannot actually give us Jesus Himself as the Eucharist does. There is no substitute for the real, life-changing encounter we have with the Risen Lord in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood which we receive every Sunday. Adults: What obstacles may be keeping you from truly being transformed by receiving Christ in the Eucharist? Children: How are you trying to be holier after receiving Jesus in the **Eucharist?**

DO YOU KNOW?

The incorruptibles are saints whose bodies are miraculously preserved after death, defying the normal process of decomposition. They are not like mummies, for the skin is soft and their limbs pliable, nothing at all like the dry skeletal remains of mummies. In usual circumstances, nothing at all has been done to preserve the bodies of these saints. In fact, some have been covered in quicklime which should have destroyed any human remains but yet it had no effect on these saints. Many of them give off a sweet, unearthly odor and others produce blood or oils that defy any scientific explanation.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Catherine of Bologna was born into an aristocratic family. She became the lady in waiting to the daughter of the Marguis. Both children received an excellent education in music, literature, painting, and dancing. At age 14 Catherine entered the order of the Poor Clares. Her roles there included laundress, baker, and animal caretaker. She suffered a spiritual crisis but she had a vision of the Real Presence in the Eucharist that brought her consolation. Spiritual visions continued to console and disturb her at various times in her life which we know from her work The Seven Spiritual Weapons. She founded a new convent in Bologna and it was there, in 1463, she became gravely ill and died at age 49. Her incorrupt body rests in Bologna. She is the patron saint of artists and her feast day is March 10th.

DIOCESE OF RICHMOND THE THIRD BISHOP

FATHER JOHN McGILL

Father John McGill was appointed the Richmond Diocese's third bishop in 1850. Before coming to Richmond, Bishop McGill was a priest in the Louisville, Kentucky Diocese. As bishop of Richmond, Bishop McGill was responsible for 7,000 Catholics, ten churches and eight priests. During his tenure, Bishop McGill and the Diocese faced many difficulties: the anti-Catholic "Know Nothing" movement, Tidewater's yellow fever epidemic, and the Civil War.

The "Know Nothing" movement was an anti-Catholic, anti-immigrant society. When its members were questioned about the secret society, they were instructed to reply, "I know nothing," hence, the name of the party.

In the summer of 1855, yellow fever swept through Portsmouth and Norfolk and claimed 3,000 lives. Ann Behan Plume Herron used her home to nurse slaves. She later donated her house to the Daughters of Charity, and this became the first Catholic hospital in the Richmond Diocese. It later became the Hospital of St. Vincent DePaul. During the Civil War, Bishop McGill was a supporter of the southern cause. He did not think that slavery was a grave sin. As early as the 15th century, popes had condemned slavery; but their declarations fell on deaf ears.

After the Civil War, the borders of the Richmond Diocese changed. The Vatican I Council was convened. Bishop McGill was in attendance; but due to ill health, he left before the Council was ended. Bishop McGill died in 1872.
