

DO YOU KNOW?

In 1931 in Poland a sister of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), is said to have been personally visited by Jesus. According to her diary an image was revealed to her of the Risen Lord, from whose heart shone two rays, one red (representing blood) and the other "pale" (symbolizing water), with the words "Jesus, I trust in You" at the bottom. Faustina wrote in her diary that Jesus told her, "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish." When she was canonized in 2000 under the direction of fellow countryman Pope John Paul II, he proclaimed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, thereby widely promoting the devotional practices associated with Faustina's visions, already popular in many communities. The celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday is an opportunity to reflect on the theme of how God's mercy can overcome sin. It is a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence. the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

In today's Gospel, Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also commissions His disciples to continue the work that He has begun. Today, let's remember that we are the disciples of Jesus. His directive to us to continue His work is an essential element of the Church. Jesus gives us the means to accomplish His mission through the eternal gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit binds us together as a community of faith, inspires us to see Him each day, and strengthens us to bear witness to His Resurrection.

Adults: What are you doing to continue Jesus' mission?

Children: What can you do to help others know about Jesus?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

We don't know very much about Saint Mary Clopas, other than that she loved Jesus, she's the mother of two sons (James and joseph) and the wife of Cleophas. Her son James was one of the Apostles, and some scholars think that her husband was the brother of Saint Joseph, our Lord's foster-father. This would explain her sometimes being called the "sister of Mary" - meaning sister-in-law. Mary Clopas was with the Blessed Mother and Mary Magdalene at the Crucifixion (John 19:25), and she also accompanied Mary Magdalene to the Lord's tomb to anoint His body (Matthew 28:1), so she was one of the first to find out about His Resurrection. We celebrate her feast day on April 24th.

Divine Mercy and Pro-life: Pope Saint John Paul II declared the Sunday after Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday. Many of the faithful pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy regularly. There is a link between this devotion and the pro-life movement. Fr. Seraphim Michalenko, MIC, who was a principal translator of St. Faustina's diary, and the postulator of her cause of canonization, writes the following: "On at least three occasions, from 8:00-11:00 in the evening, she felt like her insides were being torn apart. She suffered so much that she thought she was going to die. The doctors couldn't figure out what was ailing her, and no medication was able to alleviate her sufferings. Later, she was given to understand that she was undergoing those pains for mothers who were aborting their children (Diary, 1276). "On another occasion, she had a vision of an angel coming with thunderbolts to destroy one of the most beautiful cities of her country. And she felt powerless to do anything about it (Diary, 474). What antidote did the Lord give her? The Chaplet of Divine Mercy. [She explained] that the city was to be chastised for its sins, primarily the sin of abortion." A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to John

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
