Masses Resume!!!

***Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular <u>Mass time.</u>

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- 1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- 3. You should arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start time for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- 4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- Everyone 10 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Face Mask. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) ***<u>Anyone</u> who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face mask, will not be admitted to Mass.
- Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- 7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
- 9. Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
- 10. No bulletins will be available at Masses. *We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK We are facing many challenges these days. It's the perfect time to bring our relationship with God front and center and realize that God and God's Kingdom are all that really matter. We forget that the Kingdom of God is not a static entity. It intrigues the human spirit and captures our attention because it never fades away and is ever new. It has inexhaustible riches that can be buried and found time and time again and never lose its luster. No matter how challenging and complicated life gets we are never alone. We know what is not of God's Kingdom: violence, hatred, despair, exclusivity, privilege, power, inequity, fear, isolation, apathy, greed, and injustice. In understanding the root cause of the presence of these in all of our stories, we will discover a pearl and walk the path to joy. Come Holy Spirit, we desperately need your wisdom! Adults: Today's Gospel reminds us that God's Kingdom is worth sacrifice. What do you need to sacrifice in order to follow God in your own life?

Children: What can you give up to follow God more closely?

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Though not specifically mentioned in scripture, Sacred Tradition tells us that Mary's parents are Anne and Joachim. Whether these are their real names or not - they represent that entire quiet series of generations who faithfully perform their duties, practice their faith, and establish an atmosphere for the coming of the Messiah, but remain obscure. We celebrate their feast day on July 26th.

DO YOU KNOW?

"Capital punishment" is another expression for the "death penalty," the legal execution of a criminal. The word capital comes from the Latin word for head. In ancient times, capital punishment was often carried out by beheading. This method has never been used in America. But criminals have been put to death by shooting, hanging, electrocution, poison gas, and lethal injection. Today, all states with the death penalty use lethal injection. Some states, however, allow one of these other methods as an option.

The Catechism teaches, "in light of the Gospel, that 'the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person."

While the death penalty "was long considered an appropriate response to the gravity of certain crimes," its use is no longer necessary to safeguard the common good. The Catechism notes that in our modern world, "more effective systems of detention have been developed, which

ensure the due protection of citizens but, at the same time, do not definitively deprive the guilty of the possibility of redemption." No sin or crime is greater than God's mercy. The sacrifice of the Cross reveals that Christ's greatest desire

is to forgive those with a repentant heart. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has long opposed the use

of the death penalty in our country. While recognizing that the Church has previously permitted its use in extreme circumstances, the bishops have said that in the United States, there are other, non-lethal means of defense against unjust aggressors that should be used instead.
