### Masses Resume!!!

\*\*\*Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular <u>Mass time.</u>

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- 1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- 3. You should arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start time for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- 4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- Everyone 10 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Face Mask. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) \*\*\*<u>Anyone</u> who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to <u>Mass.</u>
- Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- 7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
- 9. Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
- 10. No bulletins will be available at Masses. \*We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK Jesus took that small gift of five loaves of bread and two fish and he multiplied it by five thousand. Sometimes Jesus can do the same with us too. We bring to Jesus the small gifts, talents and abilities that we have and he makes our gifts grow, if we cooperate with the graces he sends to us. When Jesus does this though, the increase in our gifts are not meant just for our own benefit. Our gifts were given to us to be shared with others too. Adults: What gift might Jesus be multiplying in your life that needs to be shared with someone who is spiritually hungry? Children: What gifts has God given you that you can share with others to teach them about Jesus?

## DO YOU KNOW?

Although in the West the Sacrament of Confirmation is usually received by Catholics as teenagers, several years after making their First Holy Communion, the Roman Catholic Church considers Confirmation to be the second of the three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism being the first and Holy Communion the third). Confirmation is regarded as the perfection of Baptism and can be celebrated as early as the age of discretion which is defined as 7 years. In the United States, Bishops set the age for Confirmation in their Diocese anywhere from the age of 7 through 16.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Peter Julian Eymard of France had a strong devotion to the Holy Eucharist and Our Lady and began his priestly life in the

Society of Mary court of adorers. On February 2, 1851 the Most Blessed Virgin spoke to him and said, "All the mysteries of my Son have a religious order of men to honor them. The Eucharist alone has none..." After several years of prudent reflection and interior combat, encouraged

by Pope Pius IX, he founded the Congregation of the Most Blessed

Sacrament at Paris on May 13, 1856. The title of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament was first given to Mary by St. Peter Julian Eymard in May 1868, while speaking to his novices. A few years later he described what her statue should look like: "the Blessed Virgin holds the Infant in her arms; and He holds a chalice in one hand and a Host in the other." He exhorted them to invoke Mary: "Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament, pray for us who have recourse to thee!" Saint Peter Julian's feast day is

August 2<sup>nd</sup>.
