

#### Masses Resume!!!

\*\*\*Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- 1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- You should arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start time for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- 5. Everyone 10 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Face Mask. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) \*\*\*Anyone who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
- Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
- 9. Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
- No bulletins will be available at Masses. \*We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

#### QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Jesus is the Presence among us who interprets for us what may seem to be incomprehensible. He makes our hearts burn again, as once they burned before. And he comes to us - not as a "ghost" walking on the water - but as He always said He would: as the hungry man, the thirsty woman, the naked child, the sick, the homeless, the refugee - and the persons who think, act and live in ways that are totally contrary to our own. Like the first disciples, we are expected to translate this mystery into the kind of faith, hope and love that we need to refashion our world. We can only do this together.

Adults: What do you think needs refashioning in the world most? What can you do to make this happen?

Children: How can you make the world a better place?

#### DO YOU KNOW?

It's alarming that so many Catholics don't believe in the Real Presence of the Eucharist. But another concern should be that many Catholics don't understand the purpose of the Eucharist. Yes, it is a time to adore our Lord, a time for intense prayer and thanksgiving, a time to join us intimately to Christ. But there is more. The Eucharistic Prayer asks that the Spirit transform us so that we can become like Christ, or as St. Augustine said, that "we become what we receive." The transformation of bread and wine into the Body, Blood, soul and Divinity of Christ should lead us to realize we need transformation, too. The Mass renews the covenant that commits us to follow in Christ's footsteps in loving our brothers and sisters, especially the poor and marginalized. The Eucharist is about making us more Christ-like so that we can continue His mission of establishing the Kingdom of God, of bringing justice and peace to the world. We consume the Body of Christ to help us to BE the Body of Christ.

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

The feast of Saint Lawrence, a third century saint, is celebrated on August 10th. Legend says that as deacon in Rome, Lawrence had the responsibility of material goods of the Church, and the distribution of alms to the poor. Fearing he would be arrested like the pope, he sought out the poor, widows, and orphans of Rome and gave them all the money he had on hand, selling even the sacred vessels of the altar to increase the sum. When the prefect of Rome heard of this, he imagined that the Christians must have considerable treasure. He sent for Lawrence and said, I am told that your priests offer in gold, that the Sacred Blood is received in silver cups, that you have golden candlesticks at your evening services. Lawrence replied that the Church was indeed rich. "I will show you a valuable part. But give me time to set everything in order and make an inventory." After three days he gathered a great number of blind, lame, maimed, leprous, orphaned, and widowed persons and put them in rows. When the prefect arrived, Lawrence simply said, "These are the treasure of the Church." The prefect was so angry he told Lawrence that he would indeed have his wish to die but it would be by inches. He had a great gridiron prepared with coals beneath it, and had Lawrence's body placed on it. After the martyr had suffered the pain for a long time, the legend concludes, he made his famous cheerful remark. "It is well done. Turn me over!" Lawrence is the patron of cooks and the poor.
