

#### Masses Resume!!!

\*\*\*Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- 1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- You should arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the 3. start time for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- 4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- 5. Everyone 10 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Face Mask. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) \*\*\*Anyone who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
- 6. Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- 7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
- Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. 9 Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
- 10. No bulletins will be available at Masses. \*We will continue to make the bulletins available online. through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.



#### QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Today's Gospel reading asks each of us whether or not we are about the Father's business. It is very easy for us to think that because we do the external things which give others and sometimes ourselves the impression that we are good Christians; that we are fulfilling the obligations which good sons and daughters of God have freely undertaken because of our baptism and confirmation. It is important for us to remember that the Father's business goes beyond the fulfilling of external obligations. It involves living spirit of the Sermon on the Mount. This spirit is revealed in the care and concern shown for others, especially the poor and the marginalized, in real practical ways. This, however, necessitates in us an ongoing conversion of heart. Adults: When have your actions not measured up to your promise? What was the outcome? Children: Why is it important

to follow through on your promises to others?

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

The names of each of the archangels tells us about the work God gave them to do. Michael's name means "who is like God," God gave Michael the responsibility of protecting us as God protects us. Gabriel's name means "hero of God." Gabriel is God's hero because he communicates God's message to people. We remember Gabriel best for being the angel who announced to Mary that she would be the mother of God's only Son. Raphael's name means "God has healed." In the Bible, Raphael heals a blind man and is said to have stirred the water in a pool where Jesus healed a paralyzed man. On the feast day of the archangels, we remember that God's messengers guide us in our journey to everlasting life with our Father. We can pray to Michael when we face temptation. We can ask Gabriel to help us say "yes" to God as Mary did so many years ago. We can pray to Raphael when we are ill or know someone who is in need of healing. Their feast day is September 29<sup>th</sup>.

## **Greater Williamsburg LIFE CHAIN**

Once again, St. Olaf Catholic Church in coordination with other Churches WELCOMES ALL to participate in the 32<sup>nd</sup> National Life Chain on Sunday, October 4<sup>th</sup> from 2:00 to 3:15pm. This will be the Greater Williamsburg area's 8<sup>th</sup> annual participation in this event. Location will be on the sidewalk facing Richmond Road starting at Centerville Road. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, and public witness of pro-life faithful standing in honor of 60+ million lives lost to abortion. It is a visual statement of solidarity by the Christian community that we support the sanctity of human life from the moment of conception to natural death.
