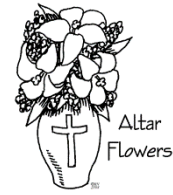

Masses Resume!!!

*****Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.**

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
3. You should arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start time for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
5. Everyone 10 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Face Mask. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) ***Anyone who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
6. Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
9. Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
10. No bulletins will be available at Masses. *We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

The Christian understanding of love involves giving selflessly to another. Love is relational. If you love someone, it doesn't merely mean you have certain feelings for that person, but that you are willing to sacrifice for their benefit. Love, in fact, is a choice. It is a choice to give freely of yourself for the good of another. With this in mind, let's consider Jesus' words again. Jesus calls us to love God with our heart, soul, and mind. In other words, He wants us to love Him with everything we are. God wants all of us. He invites us to love Him because that is what we have been created for. In fact, a loving relationship with God is what is best for us. And if we truly love God with all that we are, then we will obey His commandments. But part of loving God is also loving others. For we can't love God without also loving those He created. In fact, often our way of loving God comes through loving our neighbor. Our neighbor, we must remember, also includes our enemies. We are called to work for the good of even those who hate us. In this way, we truly live out the Christian life.

Adults: How has God's love for you helped you to act charitably toward others?
Children: Does God's love for you help you to show love toward others?

DO YOU KNOW?

Relics are physical objects that have a direct association with the saints or with our Lord. They are usually broken down into three classes: First Class relics are the body or fragments of the body of a saint, such as pieces of bone or flesh. Second Class relics are something that a saint personally owned, such as a shirt or book (or fragments of those items). Third Class relics are those items that a saint touched or that have been touched to a first, second, or another Third Class relic of a saint. The word relic means "a fragment" or "remnant of a thing that once was but now is no longer."

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Jude was one of Jesus' 12 apostles, chosen to spread the Word of the Gospel. He was also known as "Thaddeus", said to be a surname for the name Labbaeus which means "heart" or "courageous". Jude became associated with desperate situations because of a letter he wrote to the Churches of the East. In it he says that the faithful must keep going even in harsh or difficult circumstances. He is thought to have been martyred in Beirut around 65AD, along with fellow apostle Simon the Zealot. He is often depicted showing a club or axe, symbolizing the way he died. He is also sometimes pictured with a flame above his head. This refers to the Pentecost, where he and the other apostles received the Holy Spirit. His feast day is October 28th.

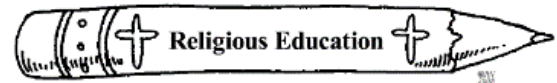
A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew
