Masses Resume!

*****Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.**

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
3. You should arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start time for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
5. Everyone 5 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Cloth Face Mask. Those who cannot wear a cloth mask may wear a face shield. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) *****Anyone who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.**
6. Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
9. Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
10. No bulletins will be available at Masses. *We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

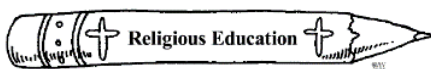

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

As we enter into another Christmas season let's take time to think about the simple Judean shepherds, who, one dark night, saw a great light, and in the power and inspiration of that light became changed men. They came to see and to worship; they returned glorifying and praising God for the things that they had learned and witnessed. We come to the Lord Jesus in like manner, but we see more than a babe in a manger. We see the King, resplendent in His power, taking to Himself the scepter of authority, bringing this evil world order to an end that He might set up in its place His own everlasting Kingdom of Peace. Like those simple shepherds, we must return glorifying and praising God for the evidence of the coming Kingdom. The people of today sadly need such a message; the time is at hand, we must tell our neighbors and friends the tremendous story of Jesus' coming.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Stephen was a faithful follower of Christ whose only crime was obedience to the Lord. He was among the first appointed deacons. The authorities accused him of blasphemy against God and falsely accused him of preaching against the Mosaic Law and the temple. As Stephen was stoned to death, he prayed that the Lord would receive his spirit and his attackers would be forgiven. His feast day is December 26th and he is the patron of stonemasons and deacons.

DO YOU KNOW?

Some people asked, "Why does the Church celebrate St. Stephen's memorial day right after Christmas when people are still celebrating Christ's birthday?" The answer might be because the Church wants to unite Christ's Incarnation with Christians' duty; that means: the Christmas' joy is that people have seen the salvation; but to achieve salvation, people must show their faith in the Son. We have a tendency to go back to our normal lives after a joyful and holy Christmas. The Church wants to remind us of our duty to be Christ's witnesses in daily life.
