

Masses Resume!

***Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.

- There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:
 - 1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
 - 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
 - 3. You should arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the start time for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
 - 4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
 - 5. Everyone 5 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Cloth Face Mask. Those who cannot wear a cloth mask may wear a face shield. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) ***<u>Anyone who comes to any Mass</u> (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
 - Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
 - 7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
 - 8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
 - 9. Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
 - 10. No bulletins will be available at Masses. *We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

DO YOU KNOW?

Archbishop Wilton Gregory recently became the Catholic Church's first African American cardinal during an installation ceremony in Rome. He was one of 13 men – and the only American – elevated to the College of Cardinals. Because of the coronavirus pandemic, two of the bishops were not in Rome for the ceremony, another first in Church history, according to Vatican News. In keeping with the Pope's concerns for Catholics who have been historically marginalized, the other new cardinals include men from Rwanda, Brunei, Chile, and the Philippines. SAINT OF THE WEEK Blessed Adolph Kolping grew up as the son of a shepherd. As the age of 18 he went to Cologne as a shoemaker's assistant. He was shocked by the living conditions of most people living there, which influenced his decision to become a priest. He was ordained on April 10, 1845. In 1847 he became the second president of the Catholic Association of Journeymen, which gave young journeymen religious and social

support. In 1849 he returned to Cologne as vicar of the cathedral and helped establish Cologne's Association of Journeymen. Until his death he labored to spread the federation of journeymen associations. By the year of his death, 1865, there were more

than four hundred journeymen associations worldwide. Blessed Kolping's feast day is December 6th and he is the patron of World Youth Day.

Mass Readings: The Second Sunday of Advent

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah

Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is explated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the LORD double for all her sins. A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God!
