Masses Continue to be Offered!

***Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- 1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- You should arrive early for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- 5. Everyone 5 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Cloth Face Mask. Those who cannot wear a cloth mask may wear a face shield. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) ***Anyone who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
- Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- 7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
- Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
- No bulletins will be available at Masses. *We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Just like in today's Gospel, Jesus is willing to touch those of us who have been rejected, abandoned, and forgotten. His compassion reaches to those who you see and those you don't see. When Jesus touched this leper, His touch said, "I love you just like you are and I am here to help you." As followers of Jesus we will need to do the same. We will have to enter the world of people, identify their pain, and touch their lives letting them know, "I love you just like you are and I am here to help you."

Adults: Who do you know that is in pain and needs your reassurance that they are loved? What can you do to help them realize they are not forgotten?

Children: What can you do to cheer up someone who is feeling sad?

About a third of the world may have a death penalty, but only nine nations across the globe still regularly execute citizens. As one of those nine nations. the United States finds itself in the company of countries like Iran, China, Somalia, Sudan and North Korea. In the list of countries that do actively enforce the death penalty, most are authoritarian governments with a terrible track record of human rights. America's status is remarkable because of its position as an active and often vocal supporter of human rights. But we are making strides in the right direction - Virginia has recently voted for the abolishment of the death penalty, making it the 23rd state and the first southern state to do so.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Jacinta (age 7) and Francisco Marto (age 9) were the two youngest of the three children who experienced the visions of the Virgin Mary at Fatima. The third child was Lucia dos Santos, age 10. Many people, including their families, did not believe the children. People laughed, ridiculed, harassed, threatened them and put them in jail for two days. But nothing could change the truth. Francisco and Jacinta died within a short time, as the Lady had said they would. They were beatified on May 13, 2000. At that time Lucia dos Santos was a Carmelite nun in Portugal. Sister Lucia died February 13, 2005 at age 97. Pope Francis canonized Francisco and Jacinta during a May 13, 2017 Mass in Fatima. We celebrate Jacinta and Francisco's feast day on February 20th.
