Masses Continue to be Offered!

 ***Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond. Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- 1. You are asked to stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- 3. You should arrive early for Mass to allow time for temperature testing, vetting and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- 4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- 5. Everyone 5 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Cloth Face Mask. Those who cannot wear a cloth mask may wear a face shield. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) ***<u>Anyone who comes to any Mass</u> (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
- 6. Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- 7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 8. Singing by the congregation is strongly discouraged.
- 9. Sanitize hands when entering and leaving Church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion, if possible.
- 10. No bulletins will be available at Masses. *We will continue to make the bulletins available online, through email, and mail bulletins to those without Internet access.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

As Jesus was in the desert enduring temptations, "the angels ministere4d to Him." The same is true with us. Our Lord does not leave us alone in the midst of our daily temptations. Rather, He always sends us His angels to minister to us and to help us defeat this vile enemy. Whatever your temptations might be, see

the Person of Christ facing those temptations with you and in you. Know that His strength is given to you if you but trust Him with unwavering confidence. Adults: What is your greatest temptation

in life and how can you avoid it? Children: When you are facing temptation, do you pray to Jesus to help you not give in to it?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Polycarp was recognized as a Christian leader by all Asia Minor Christians - a strong fortress of faith and loyalty to Jesus Christ. His own strength emerged from his trust in God, even when events contradicted his trust. Living among pagans and under a government opposed to the new religion, he led and fed his flock. Like the Good Shepherd, he laid down his life for his sheep and kept them from more persecution in Smyrna. He summarized his trust in God just before he died: "Father...I bless Thee, for having made me worthy of the day and the hour..." At 86, Polycarp was led into the crowded Smyrna stadium to be burned alive. The flames did not harm him and he was finally killed by a dagger. The centurion ordered the saint's body burned. He died in 155 and is the patron of earaches and dysentery. We celebrate his feast day on February 23rd.

DO YOU KNOW?

The Cathedra Petri (from Latin, "Chair of Peter") is an ancient, ornamented chair located in the apse of St. Peter's Basilica. This chair has been repaired and ornamented over time. The Feast of the Chair of St. Peter, observed on February 22nd, celebrates the Papacy and St. Peter as the first Bishop of Rome.

God is a God of life, and therefore we are the People of Life. This Lent, let's look for ways to foster respect for life, especially the sick, the disabled, and the unborn. (Priests for Life)

A reading from the Book of Genesis
