Masses Continue to be Offered!

***Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond.

Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- For those who have not received a vaccine and continue to feel uncomfortable returning to Mass, Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- 2. If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- You should arrive early for Mass to allow time for temperature testing and being seated by the ushers. The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- 5. Everyone 5 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Cloth Face Mask. Those who cannot wear a cloth mask may wear a face shield. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.) ***Anyone who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
- Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- 7. Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 8. Singing by the congregation is discouraged.
- 9. Sanitize hands when entering & leaving Church.
- 10. Bulletins will be available at Masses.



QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Today's Gospel should question us about our testimony. We cannot claim that we have met Jesus if our lives do not show the indelible signs of this encounter. We must be careful not to be those responsible for the doubt in so many men and women who seek untiringly the traces of the Risen One in us. Perhaps it would be better to accept the doubts that hide in us, our incredulity, our kinship with Thomas, so as not to frighten ourselves if we find that we live our spiritual lives imperfectly, sometimes believing and sometimes doubting. The good news is that even when the doors of our hearts are closed. Jesus comes to visit us all the same.

Children: Even though you can't see

Jesus in others?

DO YOU KNOW?

The Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes is a popular pilgrimage destination for those seeking miraculous healings. The shrine holds a spring of water which is said to have miraculous healing properties.

While there have been more than 7,000 miraculous recoveries attributed to the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes at the French shrine, only 70 cases have been officially recognized by the Catholic Church, the last occurring in 2008. A miraculous recovery must generally be complete, spontaneous, and immediate healing from a documented medical condition

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Bernadette Soubirous was born at Lourdes, France on January 7th. She was the oldest of nine children and the family lived in extreme poverty. She was uneducated and she was a sickly child as she suffered from asthma.

When she was 14 years old and collecting firewood she saw a vision of the Virgin Mary in a cover above the riverbank. Mary would appear to her 17 more times. Despite great hostility on the part of the civil authorities. Bernadette persisted in her claims. On February 25th a spring began to flow where none had been before. Our Lady told her that she was "The immaculate Conception" and directed her to have a chapel built on the site. She later became a Sister of Notre Dame and remained there until she died on April 16th at the age of 35. Thirty years after her death, St. Bernadette's coffin was opened as a standard step of the beatification process. A table had been set up for her bones to be placed on, but to the wonder of all, when the tomb was opened, her body was discovered perfectly incorrupt. Although her rosary had rusted, there was no sign of decay in St. Bernadette; she looked as if she had merely fallen asleep. Her incorrupt body can be seen today, at the Chapel of St. Gildard in Nevers, France. Her feast day is April 16th and she is the patron saint of the poor, those ridiculed for their faith, the sick, and shepherds.

***Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the gift of mercy and love given through Christ's death, burial, and Resurrection.

We celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy on the Sunday after Easter Sunday. As Saint Pope John Paul II stated, "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified." At a time when some Catholics had an image of God as such a strict judge that they might be tempted to despair about the possibility of being forgiven, Jesus chose to emphasize His mercy and forgiveness for sins acknowledged and confessed. Sister Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, received several visions from Christ in the period of 1931-1938. He urged her to tell the world of His love and mercy for all sinners. "I do not want to punish aching mankind," He told her "but I desire to heal it, pressing it to My merciful heart." The two rays emanating from Christ's heart, she said, represent the blood and water poured out after Jesus' death. The Chaplet: Today's observance of Divine Mercy Sunday is a good time to renew our devotion to the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. There is a close link between this devotion and the pro-life movement. Fr. Seraphim Michalenko, MIC, who was a principal translator of St. Faustina's diary, and the postulator of her cause of canonization, writes the following "On at least three occasions, from 8:00-11:00 in the evening, she felt like her insides were being torn apart. She suffered so much that she thought she was going to die. The doctors couldn't figure out what was ailing her, and no medication was able to alleviate her sufferings. Later, she was given to understand that she was undergoing those pains for mothers who were aborting their children (Diary, 1276). "On another occasion, she had a vision of an angel coming with thunderbolts to destroy one of the most beautiful cities of her country. And she felt powerless to do anything about it (Diary, 474). What antidote did the Lord give her? The Chaplet of Divine Mercy. [She explained] that the city was to be chastised for its sins, primarily the sin of abortion." ("Wombs of Mercy," Marian Helpers Bulletin, Summer 1995, p.13). In 2003, Pope John Paul II issued an Apostolic Blessing to all who pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet "for mothers, that they not abort their offspring; for infants in danger of being put to death in the womb; for a change of heart of providers of abortions and of their collaborators; for human victims of stem cell research, genetic manipulation, cloning and euthanasia; and for all entrusted with the government of peoples, that they may promote the Culture of Life, so as to put an end to the culture of death." (Priests for Life)
