Masses Continue to be Offered!

***Due to COVID-19, Mass is being live streamed for use on various Diocesan digital media accounts of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, including, but not limited to, the websites of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond and the Catholic Virginian, and social media platforms of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond.

Photography and/or screenshot images from the livestream may be used for the Catholic Virginian print edition. If you do not wish to be captured by live streaming, please refrain from attending that particular Mass time.

There will be some mandated changes to how we practice our Mass. Effective immediately:

- For those who have not received a vaccine and continue to feel uncomfortable returning to Mass, Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.
- If you have a fever or symptoms of Covid-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.
- You should arrive early for Mass to allow time for temperature testing and being seated by the ushers.
 The ushers will let each pew know the staggered process for exiting the Church once Mass is over.
- 4. Everyone shall maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in Church or on Church property.
- 5. Everyone 5 years and older attending Mass shall wear a Cloth Face Mask. Those who cannot wear a cloth mask may wear a face shield. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth. (Face mask should be removed only for Receiving Holy Communion.)

 ***Anyone who comes to any Mass (including daily Mass) without a face covering, will not be admitted to Mass.
- Look for direction from the ushers when going up to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion should be received in the hand until further notice. There will be no distribution of the Blood of Christ until further notice.
- Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 8. Singing by the congregation is discouraged.
- 9. Sanitize hands when entering & leaving Church.
- 10. Bulletins will be available at Masses.



DO YOU KNOW?

Seven people, Catholic priests and nuns, were kidnapped in Haiti on Sunday, April 11th and are being held for ransom. The five priests and two nuns were abducted at Croix-des-Bouquets, a suburb of Haiti's capital of Port-au-Prince. According to local news, they were taken while on the way to attend the installation of a parish priest. According to Haitian media, the "400 Mawozo" gang admitted culpability for the kidnapping, and is demanding \$1 million in ransom. Bishop Pierre-Andre Dumas told AFP that "the Church prays and stands in solidarity with all the victims of this heinous act. This is too much," he said. "The time has come for these inhuman acts to stop." The Archdiocese of Port-au-Prince warned in a statement that gang violence has reached "unprecedented" levels in the country. (Please pray for a peaceful solution for those involved.)

SAINT OF THE WEEK

In less than 40 years, Gianna Beretta Molla became a pediatric physician, a wife, a mother and a saint! She became a doctor and specialized in pediatrics. Early in her fourth pregnancy, doctors discovered that Gianna had both a child and a tumor in her uterus. She allowed the surgeons to remove the tumor but not to perform the complete hysterectomy that they recommended, which would have killed the child. Seven months later in April 1962, Gianna Emanuela Molla was born at the hospital in Monza, but post-operative complications resulted in an infection for her mother. The following week Gianna Molla died at home, and was buried in the cemetery of Mesero. We celebrate her feast day on April 28th. She is the patron of mothers, physicians and unborn children



Easter is a Season: Just as Sunday is one day out of seven, so the Easter season, a period of 50 days, is approximately one-seventh of the year. The Easter season, a time of special rejoicing and celebration of the Resurrection of Christ, is the "Great Sunday" of the year. The liturgical prayers and readings focus on the Resurrection and the effects that it has on believers and on the world. The Acts of the Apostles is a book of Scripture that provides the source of most of the readings of the Easter Season, and it shows the vigor with which the apostles proclaimed the Resurrection and brought many to the waters of baptism to share the new life of Christ. This season is a celebration of life, and leads us all to a deeper commitment to proclaim, celebrate, and serve the gift of human life. (Priests for Life)

***What do we know about the Risen Lord Jesus? Well, we know He can walk through walls, can disappear and reappear in an instant, and can appear in a dazzling light to disguise His appearance. Here, in the wake of the Resurrection, Jesus is reminding us that He is God, and that He had won the victory over death. And yet, Jesus also chooses to remind His Apostles, and us today, that He is also fully human: He not only eats fish, but He interrupts a post-Resurrection moment of catechesis to ask for it! In doing so, and also showing the wounds of His crucifixion, Jesus is reminding us how close He is to us and our humanity. Because when you love something, you don't hold back; you draw close and are willing to be bold, to have some "skin in the game." We have an opportunity to follow Christ's lead in our own parish community, by supporting the Diocesan Annual Appeal and our parish Capital Campaign. We may belong to this parish, but are we really invested? Supporting the parish financially is a great way to put our love into action, to allow it to take flesh, as God did among us through His Incarnation. Let's ask God for the clarity to see how He wants us to "incarnate" our love for our parish.
