#### QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Today's Gospel reading reminds us not to forget that we have something more than the garment of Christ: Our Lord's Real Presence in the Eucharist! Not only can we touch Him, but receive Him as well in our body and soul in grace...God in our body and soul! And Jesus longs for us, for our presence, for our details of love and affection. Jesus promised to be with us always and indeed He is through prayer, the Sacraments and the Eucharist at Mass!

Adults: How does the Eucharist nourish and enrich your lives, especially in times of doubt and uncertainty? Children: How can receiving Jesus in the Eucharist make your faith stronger?

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Oliver Plunkett was ordained in 1654. After some years of teaching and service to the poor of Rome he was appointed Archbishop of Armagh in Ireland. Four years later, in 1673, a new wave of anti-Catholic persecution began, forcing Archbishop Plunkett to do his pastoral work in secrecy and disguise and to live in hiding. Meanwhile, many of his priests were sent into exile, schools were closed, Church services had to be held in secret, and convents and seminaries were suppressed. As Archbishop Plunkett was

suppressed. As Archbishop, Plunkett was viewed as ultimately responsible for any rebellion or political activity among his parishioners. Archbishop Plunkett was arrested and imprisoned in Dublin Castle in 1679, but his trial was moved to London. After deliberating for 15 minutes, a jury found him guilty of fomenting revolt. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered in July 1681. His feast day is July 1<sup>st</sup>.

### DID YOU KNOW?

The persecution of Christians is not just from previous periods of history. People are still suffering today for their belief in Christ. In just the last year, there have been: Over 340 million Christians living in places where they experience

high levels of persecution and discrimination; 4,761 Christians were killed for their faith; 4,488 Churches and other Christian buildings attacked and 4,277 believers detained without trial, arrested, sentenced or imprisoned.
