**MEDITATION OF THE WEEK**

"Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs, but because you ate the loaves and were filled." The people, like us, believe in God because of physical evidence in our lives; being full is being happy. Having faith in God is knowing that even when times are trying or difficult that God is not just feeding our bellies, He is feeding our very souls. It's in our trials that we come to know Jesus; He is the Bread sent down from Heaven. Humbling Himself from Creator, to become the created human, in order to show us how to live for eternal life. If we pray, believe and trust, there is no physical sign needed, we will know He is present without a sign. We will accept everything that comes to us in good times and in bad, knowing that Jesus knows the path to life, and we will follow.

**THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH**

Consecration to St. Joseph will increase the presence of the Father in your life. **The Fatherhood of St. Joseph increased the presence of the Heavenly Father in the life of Jesus.** Now, to be clear, St. Joseph is not God. He cannot add anything to the divine and eternal communion existing between God the Father and God the Son. Nor can St. Joseph improve the ability of Jesus, as a Divine person, to perpetually behold the presence of His Heavenly Father. Rather, St. Joseph was chosen to stand in the place of the Heavenly Father according to the demands of Jesus' human nature. God the Father doesn't have a human nature. Every time Jesus saw St. Joseph, heard him speak, watched him work, or witnessed his chaste love for Mary, the humanity of Jesus witnessed a perfect reflection of the Heavenly Father. **Pray the Litany of St. Joseph.**

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

Alphonsus Liguori was Bishop, Doctor of the Church, and the founder of the Redemptorist Congregation. Raised in a pious home, Alphonsus was the oldest of seven children. Educated at the University of Naples, Alphonsus received his doctorate at the age of sixteen. By age nineteen he was practicing law. Visiting the local Hospital for Incurables on August 28, 1723, he had a vision and was told to consecrate his life solely to God. In response, Alphonsus dedicated himself to the religious life. For thirteen years Alphonsus fed the poor, instructed families, reorganized the seminary and religious houses, taught theology, and wrote. His austerities were rigorous, and he suffered daily the pain from rheumatism that was beginning to deform his body. He spent several years having to drink from tubes because his head was so bent forward. An attack of rheumatic fever, from May 1768 to June 1769, left him paralyzed. He experienced visions, performed miracles, and gave prophecies. He died peacefully on August 1, 1787, at Nocera di Pagani, near Naples as the Angelus was ringing. He was beatified in 1816 and canonized in 1839.

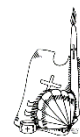
### Come Help Father Oscar Celebrate 40 Years of Service to the Lord and His people!!!

## **Mass Readings: Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

### **A reading from the Book of Exodus**

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, "Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not. "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God." In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them, "This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."
