## SAINT OF THE WEEK

Pope St. Gregory the Great (Pope and Doctor of the Church) Gregory was born around 640 in Rome. Gregory was well educated and excelled in all his studies, he became an expert in law. He excelled so much he became the Prefect of Rome, just as his father had been. Gregory was only 33 years old. After Gregory's father died, Gregory had the family villa in Rome converted into a monastery, where he served his life as a monk. He sent many people out to bring many to Jesus and into the Church, he gave his alms to the poor, and he gave guite generously of the riches donated to the Church by the wealthy people of Rome. He also made certain to dine with a dozen poor people at each meal. Everything from money to land was given to the poor in some fashion. He made clear to his subordinates that their duty was to relieve the distress

faced by the poor.

### The Holy Gospel According to Mark

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves.
