MEDITATION OF THE WEEK

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." These words are very difficult to swallow. Why would God give us life and then tell us we need to lose it? The world speaks to us; the message we hear is in order to be successful, we have to be a certain image, profession, title, have money. God calls us to leave these worldly things behind, deny ourselves of the things of the world because they become a distraction

to our purpose. That purpose is to help others to know Christ, to live in Christ and serve Christ. We ourselves must be the Christ's in the world, no matter what we are

doing. We are followers of Christ, which makes us friends of Christ. In our relationship we find trust in the one who can take care of every obstacle that comes our way, because He is the Creator of all things. In Christ, we find our peace.

THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

St. Joseph was King of the Holy Family. He was not the King of Nazareth, Israel, or anything like that. Since every man is the king of his home, St. Joseph was the king of his house. In the home of Nazareth, St. Joseph was king. Mary was queen, and Jesus was the prince awaiting the kingdom prepared for Him by His Heavenly Father. Jesus is King of Kings and Lord of Lords, of course, but God's providential love desires that we acknowledge the kingship of St. Joseph in the Holy Family. SAINT OF THE WEEK

The life of St. Catherine of Genoa may be more properly described as a state than as a life in the ordinary sense. When about twenty-six years old she became the subject of one of the most extraordinary operations of God in the human soul of which we have record, the result of being a marvelous inward condition that lasted till her death. In this state, she received wonderful revelations, of which she spoke at times to those around her, but which are mainly embodied in her two celebrated works: the "Dialogues of the Soul and Body", and the "Treatise on Purgatory". She died worn out with labors of body and soul, and consumed, even physically, by the fires of Divine love within her. She was beatified in 1675, by Clement V, but not canonized till 1737, by Clement XII. Meantime, her writings had been examined by the Holy Office and pronounced to contain

doctrine that would be enough, in itself, to prove her sanctity. Her Feast Day is September 15th.
