### SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Emilie de Rodat

Born near Rodez, France, she became a nun at St. Cyr when eighteen. In 1815 after mush dissatisfaction, she decided that her vocation was in teaching poor children.

With the approval of Abbe Marty, her spiritual adviser, and the aid of three young assistants, she began this work in her room at St. Cyr. This was the start of the Congregation of the Holy Family of Villefranche. It grew rapidly, establishing it own mother house and branches. In time, St. Emily extended its activities to caring for unfortunate women, orphans and the aged. She saw thirty-eight institutions established before she died. She was canonized in 1950. Her feast date is September 19<sup>th</sup>.
