Per the Virginia Department of Health:

MEDITATION ON THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

The souls in purgatory died in the mercy of God, this is why they are called holy; however, because they still had attachment to sin at the time of their death, they must undergo a spiritual purification of their souls before they are able to fully love God with their whole heart, mind, and soul for all eternity. The holy souls are "saved souls" – they will enjoy the reward of heaven – but during their lives they were not the perfect souls that Christ commanded them to be (Matthew 5:48), and for which He provided every grace and means for them to become (2 Peter 1:3). We are meant to die after living as saints. Those who die in the love of God but fall short of holiness due to habitual sinful clinging's must be pure before being admitted to the beatific vision, that is, the vision of God that the saints in heaven enjoy for all eternity. Requiem; "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let the perpetual light shine upon them. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the Mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Feast Day, November 10th - St. Leo the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church
 He died in Rome on this day in 461. He was elected pope in 440 and tried to protect the city from the devastation of barbarian invasion. His surviving letters illustrate the leadership and guidance he exercised as bishop of Rome toward other Churches in the West. Noted for the clarity of his thought on the two natures of Christ, he was affirmed at the Council of Chalcedon for his eloquent sermons and for the prayers he composed for the Roman liturgy.

St. Joseph Most Chaste

Lust is the predominant vice at work in the hearts of men today. The world is filled with immoral and lust-filled actions.

These actions greatly offend God, ruin families, and cry out to heaven for justice. Did not Our Lady warn St. Jacinta of Fatima that many souls go to hell because of sins of the flesh? In the battle for purity, everyone needs to go to

St. Joseph. If a man or a woman struggles with lust, they must go to St. Joseph. If temptations against purity batter your mind, heart and soul, run to your spiritual father. Cling to St. Joseph!

Your spiritual father is capable of increasing the virtue of chastity in your heart and leading you to true, virtuous love of God and neighbor. You will be victorious against lust and triumphant over sin if you take refuge beneath the fatherly cloak of St. Joseph. Prayer is difficult when you are assailed with temptations against purity, but St. Joseph will fight for you if only you invoke his holy name.
