Month of the Holy Family

The Holy Family observed the Jewish law in its perfection. A very interesting Jewish custom of prayer that must have been observed in the house at Nazareth was that of the Mezuzah, "the doorpost," and the "phylacteries," small square calfskin boxes with Scripture texts written on parchment inside them. On the doorpost of the house at Nazareth was fastened a wooden tube containing a rolled parchment inscribed with the passage quoted above from the Book of Deuteronomy and another passage (11:13-21) citing the blessings of serving God. On entering and leaving the house the members of the Holy Family would piously touch this Mezuzah, saying, "May God keep my going out and coming in from now on and forevermore." All this was intended to show reverence for the Word of God.

Saint of the Week

March 3rd - St. Katharíne Drexel

St. Katharine Drexel was born in Philadelphia on November 26th, 1858. She was the second child of a wealthy banker.

The girls received a wonderful education from private tutors and traveled throughout the United States and Europe. The Drexels were financially and spiritually well

endowed. They were devout in the practice of their faith, setting an excellent example of true Christian living for their three daughters. They not only prayed but practiced what the Church calls the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. On February 12, 1891 Katharine made her first vows as a religious and dedicated herself to working for the Native Americans and blacks in the Western United States. She is the founder of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament and of Xavier University in New Orleans. Katharine died on March 3, 1955 at the

age of 96.

The title "Terror of Demons" is the most unique title of St. Joseph. It is a fearsome and commanding title. It is the title of a warrior. The lily St. Joseph holds in his hand is a mighty spiritual weapon, a sword of purity. It has the power to pierce fire-breathing dragons (demons) and conquer every form of filth and darkness. The lily he wields is a threat to all the filthy forces of Satan. When St. Joseph rises from sleep, demons know he will promptly do the will of God and block their evil intentions. St. Joseph is a quiet man, but he is not a timid man. One glance of his eyes sends all hell into flight. One word from his mouth routs the forces of darkness as an axe levels a field of trees! Who can stand against you if the Terror of Demons protects you? To defeat the devil, you need Jesus, Mary, St. Joseph, and the teachings and Sacraments of the Catholic Church. Every Christian needs the truth and strong spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph.
