# The Year of Grace, with Divine Mercy

The Image of the Merciful Jesus. His image was revealed in a vision that Sr. Faustina had on February 22, 1931, in her convent cell at Plock. She recorded in the Diary: "In the evening, when I was in my cell. I saw the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in the gesture of blessing, the other was touching the garment at the breast. From beneath the garment, slightly drawn aside at the breast, there were emanating two large rays, one red, the other pale... After a while Jesus said to me, Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with signature: "Jesus, I trust In You" ((Diary, 47). I want this image to be...solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter: that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy. The two rays are a distinctive feature of this image of Christ. The Lord Jesus, when asked about their meaning, explained: The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. ... Happy is the one who will dwell in the shelter (Diary, 299). The Sacraments of Baptism and Penance purify the soul, and the Eucharist most abundantly nourishes it. Thus, the two rays signify the Holy Sacraments and all the graces of the Holy Spirit, whose biblical symbol is water, as well as the New Covenant of God with men in the Blood of Christ. The Image of the Merciful Jesus is often called the "Image of Divine Mercy," which is appropriate, since it is precisely in Christ's Paschal Mystery that God's love for humankind was most explicitly revealed. When we venerate this image with personal trust in Jesus and perform works of mercy out of love for Him and our neighbor, the Lord fulfills His promise by offering us extraordinary graces. These are: eternal salvation, great progress in the way of Christian perfection, the grace of a happy death, and all other possible graces which people will as of Him with trust: By means of this Image I shall be granting many graces to souls; so let every soul have access to it (Diary, 570).

### Saint of the Week

# St. Paschal Baylon

St. Paschal Baylon, was a Franciscan lay brother and mystic. Born to a peasant family at Torre Hermosa, in Aragon, on Whitsunday, he was christened Pascua in honor of the feast. According to accounts of his early life, Paschal labored as a shepherd for his father, performed miracles, and was distinguished for his austerity. He also taught himself to read. Receiving a vision which told him to enter a nearby Franciscan community, he became a Franciscan lay brother of the Alcan trine reform in 1564, and spent most of his life as a humble doorkeeper.

He practiced rigorous <u>asceticism</u> and displayed a deep love for the Blessed Sacrament, so much so that while on a mission to France, he defended the doctrine of the Real Presence against a Calvinist preacher and in the face of threats from other irate Calvinists. Paschal died at a friary in Villareal, and was canonized in 1690. In 1897 Pope Leo XIII declared him patron of all Eucharistic confraternities and congresses. Since 1969, his veneration has been limited to local calendars.
