# The Year of Grace, with Divine Mercy

Divine Mercy Sunday...The greatness of this feast is measured by extraordinary promises that the Lord attached to it. Jesus said: ...whoever approaches the Fount of Life of this day will be granted complete remission of sins and punishment (Diary, 300), and also: On this day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy...Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet (Diary, 699). To receive this great gift of complete remission of sins and punishment, we can receive the Lord Jesus present in Holy Communion. In this way, we fulfill the Lord's request: The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain compete forgiveness of sins and punishment (Diary, 699). Receiving the Lord worthily is essential for obtaining the promised grace, but our faith must show itself in our trust and in our acts of love: No soul will be justified until it turns with confidence to My mercy (Diary, 570). We must put faith in God's goodness and love toward us, His wayward children. We must place our trust in His tender mercy no matter how greatly we have offended Him. We must draw near to Him who redeemed us by His suffering and death borne for us, and, out of our love for Him, draw near to our poor and suffering brothers and sisters and bring them relief through spiritual and corporal works of love and mercy. Jesus expects this from us: I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere (Diary, 742).

# Saint of the Week

St. Philip Neri

Feast Day- May 26th

St. Philip Neri was a 16th-century man (1515–1595) who became a mystic and missionary, a priest and a prophet, a founder of the Oratory and a healer of souls. He became well-known in and around Rome, where he lived, which at the time was deeply in need of reform and spiritual renewal. He started to study for the priesthood but after three years he gave it up. At the time the inhabitants of Rome were no longer leading a Christian life. Philip set out to bring others to God, and in so doing became known as 'The Apostle of Rome.' He looked out for the destitute in the gutters and alleys of Rome, for the sick in hospitals bringing them food and gifts. He was always joyful and humorous, sharing a joke and laughter, building up their morale. Young people followed him attracted by his natural warmth, his cordiality and his love of God. From enjoyable discussions, fun, music and song, he would lead them to prayer and to Jesus Christ! He soon became a popular personality as he continued to evangelize wherever people gathered, with his holiness shining through his jovial attitudes. Away from the public eye he spent nights in prayer, even eating frugally. Eventually Philip continued with his studies for the priesthood and he was ordained priest when he continued with his mission mainly through the confessional. Philip used the virtue of affability and a spirit of joyfulness to guide people to a holier life.

# The Creator's Eternal Dream

Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Exhortation "The Joy of Love," writes, "The Psalmist says: "You knit me together in my mother's womb" (Ps 139:13).
