The Year of Grace, with Divine Mercy

St. Faustina's Mission- As His secretary and apostle of Divine Mercy, the Lord Jesus chose St. Faustina to proclaim His message of mercy to the world. He said to her: "In the Old Covenant I sent prophets wielding thunderbolts to My people. Today I am sending you with My mercy to the people of the whole world. I do not want to punish aching mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to My Merciful Heart (Diary, 1588)." Sister Faustina's mission consist of the following three tasks:

-To Introduce and proclaim to the world the truth revealed in the Holy Scriptures about the merciful love of God for every human being.

-To entreat God's mercy for the whole world, especially through new forms of devotion to The Divine Mercy given by the Lord Jesus. These are: The Image of the Divine Mercy and the inscription: "Jesus, I trust in You"; the Feast of the Divine Mercy on the Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday); The Divine Mercy Chaplet; and the prayer and meditation on His Passion at the Hour of Great Mercy (3 o'clock in the afternoon).

-To inspire the apostolic movement of the Divine Mercy which continues St. Faustina's mission of proclaiming and entreating God's mercy for the world, as well as striving for perfection in the footsteps of St. Faustina. Our Lady of Fatima May 13th Feast Day

May 13th marks the Anniversary of the first of six apparitions of the Virgin Mary to three shepherd children of Fatima, Portugal. Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francesco and Jacinta Marto. Our Lady of Fatima, also called (Lady of the Rosary) is the title given to Mary in connection with her apparitions to three shepherd children In Fatima, Portugal. Our Lady of Fatima told the shepherd children to pray the Rosary daily for the end of the war, for world conversion and peace. Our Lady shared 3 secrets with the children that would take place, a great warning being one. October 13, 1917, a miracle was given for people to believe, and over 70,000 people witnessed the Miracle of the Sun. The bishop of Leiria, José Alves Correia da Silva declared the events *worthy of belief* on October 13th, 1930.
