#### Saint of the Week

#### St. Anthony of Padua

#### Feast Day- June 13th

Anthony's birth and baptismal name was Fernando Martins. He was born in Portugal in 1195 to a wealthy family, yet he felt called to the priesthood and chose a life of poverty. At the age of fifteen he traveled to the capital of Portugal to study to become a priest.

After his ordination, he lived at an abbey and was responsible for taking care of visiting guests. Once when some Franciscans were visiting, Fernando felt called to join their order. When he took the vows of this order, he changed his name to Anthony.

The plan was for Anthony to travel to Morocco to help spread the Catholic faith. While there, he became very sick. Being so sick, his superiors decided to send him back to Portugal. On the way home, a storm came and blew his ship off course. Instead of landing back in Portugal they landed in Sicily, off the southern coast of Italy. Being ill and weak, Anthony's stayed with some local friars to regain his health. He spent a long time there praying and studying.

Anthony became known as a great preacher. Books back in this time were rare and highly treasured. Anthony had a book that he often used for reference when teaching. One day it was stolen. Saint Anthony prayed that the thief would return it. His prayer was answered. The thief even eventually became a member of his religious order!

This is why Saint Anthony is often called upon by people who are searching for lost items.

## The Year of Grace, with Divine Mercy The Apostolic Movement

The Divine Mercy message and devotion aims at the renewal of religious life in the Church in the spirit of Christian trust and mercy. It is in this context that the idea of the "new congregation" of which we read in the Diary's pages should be considered.

This desire of Christ matured gradually in St. Faustina's own thinking, and underwent a certain evolution-from a strictly contemplative order all the way to a movement that is made up also of active religious congregations and of laypeople. This large international community of people concentrates on family, which is being united by God in the mystery of His mercy. It is also united by the desire to reflect this attribute of God in one's own heart and deed, and to reflect His glory in all souls. It is a community of people of faith who in different ways depending on one's profession and vocation (clergy, religious, laity), live by the evangelical ideal of trust and mercy, who preach by life and by word the ineffable mystery of God's mercy and who plead God's mercy for the whole world.

This community of people consists of congregations, communities, fraternities, associations, and nonaffiliated individuals, that is, all those who engage in the realization of the mission of St. Faustina.

## **Priests for Life**

#### Praise the Holy Trinity

Some truths, like the very existence of God, can be known by human reason alone.

Other truths, like the fact that God is One in Three Persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – can only be known if God reveals them to us. We could never conclude on our own that God is a Trinity.

Today's Feast is not only an opportunity for thanking God for telling us more about himself. It is an occasion to take courage as we strive for deeper unity within the human family.

God reveals himself to us in order to make us more like himself – not just as individuals, but as families, nations, and an international community.

We grow in unity as we give ourselves away to one another, just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit give themselves to each other completely.
