### The Season of Advent

In the Catholic Church, Advent is a period of preparation extending over the four Sundays before Christmas. The word *Advent* comes from the Latin *advenio*, "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. And the term *the coming* includes three references: first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas; second, to the coming or arrival of Christ in our lives through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion; and finally, to his second coming at the end of time.

Our preparations, therefore, should have all three comings in mind. We need to prepare our souls to receive Christ worthily. Advent itself is a time of preparation, to prepare for Christ's coming on Christmas.


### Father Oscar Thanksgiving Homily

If you know of someone who needs a food basket, please contact the Parish office.




By the end of this weekend, we will have helped 45 children have a Merry Christmas and ease the minds of the parents.



### The Season of Advent

#### Way's to Prepare For Christ's Coming During the Advent Season:

##### **Pray more:**

You could pray the Rosary daily, read in the Bible each day, or spend more time in personal prayer, just talking with God. The prayers in Advent will focus on preparing for Jesus.

##### **Go to Mass more often:**

You may want to go to Mass more often or participate in an online Mass during the week as well as on Sundays. Attending Mass more often helps us to keep our focus on God during Advent and less on the societal consumerism of Christmas. You could also read the Mass readings each day. The USCCB has the daily Mass readings online for easy reference. Free copies of the "Little Blue book" are at the back of church. This will help with daily reflections and meditation.

##### **Go to Confession:**

Advent is a time of preparation. It's also referred to as a mini-Lent. One of the best ways to prepare our hearts is to clean them. Confession cleans our souls of sin, which separates us from God and helps us to get our hearts in the right place to receive Him in His fullness.

#### Priests for Life The Divine Child's Birth

Advent leads the Church to the Silent Night when God Himself is revealed as one of us. This season leads us to the joy of His birth. If God has joined His nature to ours, how can we ever allow our nature to be despised? If He has come to bring us Divine Life, and will return to take us to the skies, how can it be all right to throw people in the garbage? May His birth shed protection on all about to be born, and as we work to end abortion, may we "wait in joyful hope for the coming of Our Savior, Jesus Christ."

### Father Oscar's Thanksgiving Homily

In the harried frenzy that surrounds the holiday, we sometimes forget the purpose of it all – to give thanks.

Sure, most of us will stop for a moment and say “thanks” – for our family, our food, our blessings. *But isn't this season about more than a momentary acknowledgment of our immediate circumstances?* Isn't it about recognizing all the assistance, support and favor that we have been shown along the way?

Perhaps there was a special teacher in your life that encouraged you to go to college or made you feel that you could achieve your vocational dreams. Or what about the boss who taught you the “way” when you were new in the company? Or the coach that showed you the importance of discipline and being a part of a team? *Have you ever thanked the people who made a significant contribution to your life?*

And let's us not forget our parents, some of whom are already deceased. In one way or another, they helped to shape us into the people that we have become. Maybe they were not perfect, but *they probably did the best they knew how to do*. And we often learn as much from our mistakes and the mistakes of others, as we do from the successes.

Thanksgiving is also a difficult time for many people. The losses in our lives seemed magnified somehow as we struggle to be grateful even with our grief. But I find it helpful to ask myself this question: Would I trade the pain I feel at their loss, for never having had the experience of knowing my loved ones? And I have to answer honestly that I am truly grateful to have had them in my life and I would do it all over again, even if I knew that I would one day have to grieve their passing.

The economic crunch is also causing many of us to suffer financial hardships. And it is tough to be thankful when we are worried about putting food on our table or a roof over our heads. But troubles are transitory – they don't last forever. So, we can be grateful for the blessings of the past and the ones yet to come.

And if we take time to look around us, there is always something for which to be thankful: health, love, hope, the kindness of others. We all have something that is going right for us at any given time. We just have to open our minds and our hearts to see the good that exists, even in the midst of the strife.

So, this Holiday Season, before we gather around our tables to share turkey, dressing and cranberry sauce, let us take time to give thanks for more than the present. Let us also give thanks for our yesterdays and for our tomorrows.

Reach out to thank those who have significantly impacted our lives. Write, call or even just lift up a prayer for them. They may need to hear, at this very moment, that they made a difference in someone else's life. If they are deceased offer a prayer for them. They will hear you.

If they happen to be seated with you at your table, do not let this opportunity to tell them what they mean to you. You will never regret telling those dear to you that you love them; but you will likely regret it if you don't.

As we gather together on these days with those we love and the memories of those who are not with us, let us be grateful for the most wonderful blessing of all – one another's love.

And finally, holiday celebrations are not complete if we forget to say a prayer of gratitude to the Lord our God. All our blessings and gifts in life come from Him. What we have and what we are is because of the Lord our God.
