

Saint of the Day

Pope St. Gregory VII Feast day- May 25th

The 10th century and the first half of the 11th were dark days for the Church, partly because the papacy was the pawn of various Roman families.

In 1049, things began to change when Pope Leo IX, a reformer, was elected. He brought a young monk named Hildebrand to Rome as his counselor and special representative on important missions. Hildebrand was to become Gregory VII.

Three evils plagued the Church then: simony—the buying and selling of sacred offices and things; the unlawful marriage of the clergy; and lay investiture—kings and nobles controlling the appointment of Church officials. To all of these Hildebrand directed his reformer's attention, first as counselor to the popes and later as pope himself. Gregory's papal letters stress the role of the bishop of Rome as the vicar of Christ and the visible center of unity in the Church. He is well known for his long dispute with Holy Roman Emperor Henry IV over who should control the selection of bishops and abbots.

Gregory fiercely resisted any attack on the liberty of the Church. For this he suffered and finally died in exile. He said, "I have loved justice and hated iniquity; therefore, I die in exile." Thirty years later the Church finally won its struggle against lay investiture.



Pentecost Voice

The Holy Spirit, who came on Pentecost, gave voice to the apostles to proclaim the truth of the Gospel. The Spirit, the Soul of the Church, continues to enable the Church to speak, and enables us to speak in our individual capacity. According to the late Cardinal Elio Sgreccia, who served as President of the Vatican's Pontifical Academy for Life, "The Church must speak out in today's context on fundamental rights, the right to justice, the right to peace, but above all and in the first place, the right to life. If the Church did not speak, did not proclaim the truth, it would be abandoning its duty; it would be unfaithful to society, to the good of society. Therefore, its precise duty is the very liberty to intervene with word, and also with example -- the example of promoting human life, of intervening for the salvation of mankind."

I am the pastor/priest at St. John's Episcopal Church in West Point and the secretary of the West Point Ministers Association. First. a hearty thanks to your parish for hosting last night's baccalaureate service. It was delightful to meet 19 of the graduates and the hospitality by Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church was so kind and gracious. From the service through the reception, much work was involved by the parish in setting up, cleaning up, offering and serving the food and drinks, etc. Thank you for your gracious hospitality.

Second, many, many thanks for your hosting the Good Neighbor Center for many decades, offering space for the ministry, paying for the utilities involved, and allowing for the foot traffic of all peoples into your wonderful campus facility. Thank you. I hope you know how much this was appreciated over the years. I hope we are able to find an alternative location and continue the ministry in physical form going forward.

As you know, we now will be offering the Good Neighbor Center ministry in virtual form. Mrs. Frances Thornton will be taking calls for financial and food support via a new phone with a new phone number. She then will contact the three churches that will house the food for them to respond as needed for any food requests. She will remain at the helm in receiving all requests but will no longer have a physical presence or interaction with the people. I am hoping this will put an end to the rather unpleasant in person exchanges that were a concern for all of us and particularly around the preschool families.

So, please change any announcements about the Good Neighbor Center to say that people may contact the West Point Ministers Association/Good Neighbor Center for financial and food assistance at **757-585-8227**. People should leave a message for a return call about available assistance. As of now, there will be no set hours or physical location. All calls should continue to flow through Mrs. Thornton rather than contacting any of the churches directly.
