

It provides safety lessons to children, helping to equip your child to recognize boundaries and to empower them to protect themselves when safe adults are not immediately available. 
Altar Flower Donations



Saint of the Week

Saint Wenceslaus September 28th

If saints have been falsely characterized as "other worldly," the life of Wenceslaus stands as an example to the contrary:

He stood for Christian values in the midst of the political intrigues which characterized 10th-century Bohemia.

Wenceslaus was born in 907 near Prague, son of the Duke of Bohemia. His saintly grandmother, Ludmilla, raised him and sought to promote him as ruler of Bohemia in place of his mother, who favored the anti-Christian factions. Ludmilla was eventually murdered, but rival Christian forces enabled Wenceslaus to assume leadership of the government.

His rule was marked by efforts toward unification within Bohemia, support of the Church, and peace-making negotiations with Germany, a policy which caused him trouble with the anti-Christian opposition. His brother Boleslav joined in the plotting, and in September of 929 invited Wenceslaus to Alt Bunglou for the celebration of the feast of Saints Cosmas and Damian. On the way to Mass, Boleslav attacked his brother, and in the struggle, Wenceslaus was killed by supporters of Boleslav.

Although his death resulted primarily from political upheaval, Wenceslaus was hailed as a martyr for the faith, and his tomb became a pilgrimage shrine. He is hailed as the patron of the Bohemian people and of the former Czechoslovakia.

- Between the ages of 30 and 59 at the time of application.
- Committed to and living out values of justice, charity and service.
- Demonstrates grateful fidelity to all that the Church teaches, openness to formation and has demonstrated leadership.

Following these sessions, a new cohort of permanent deacons will be formed in 2024. Our permanent deacons are assigned to a parish where they exercise liturgical and catechetical ministries within their parish communities. Deacons hold roles both in their church and in a variety of secular professions, showing how unique this vocation is. Please prayerfully discern whether you may be called to join a thriving and essential vocation to serve the Church in a new way. 



Parish Council Minutes

Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church

July 30, 2023

Members Present: Fr. Oscar, Tiffany Smith (Chair), Jim Vadas, Terry Frederick, Sal Inga, Bob Ryalls

Additional Visitors Present: Mason Kopacki, Kaylee Votto (Tiffany's niece)

Meeting Called to Order: Tiffany called the meeting to order.

Prayer: Tiffany led the meeting with the prayer "Opening Prayer" [from the Second Vatican Council].

Minutes: Approval of minutes from the June meeting was motioned by Jim, seconded by Terry, and were approved unanimously. It was noted that contractors who are also parishioners have not gotten back with Jim Pyne or Bob Ryalls about interest in working on the floors of the Preschool building.

Mason Kopacki Eagle Scout Project Presentation: Mason presented his plan for an outdoors Stations of the Cross trail. This will be located in the wooded area behind the parking lot between the hall and the church. Mason displayed the type of marker planned for each Station. These will be 9" x 6" aluminum plates housed in wood frames. He is considering asking parishioners to sponsor and donate the money for each station for which a plaque would be installed recognizing their contribution and whether it was in memory of someone. The 15th Station will be a large cross. Labor will be provided by Mason's Scout troop along with Jose's crew. Benches and statues will depend on fundraising. He expects the project to cost between \$3,400 and \$5,000. Plans are to complete the project by year end.

Plantings around property: Alfred Jones is working on planting flowers/shrubs around the announcement sign in front of the Boogaard Hall.

Preschool: The floors and structure are going to be inspected in the next week or two. It was noted that contractors who are also parishioners have not gotten back with Jim Pyne or Bob Ryalls about interest in working on the floors of the Preschool building.

Unless some issues arise, preschool should continue as normal in the Preschool Building.

Capital Campaign:	\$453,606 is total to date
	381,250 are pledges

	134,416 remaining pledges to collect

Bob was asked about the detailed capital campaign expenses to-date that was requested last meeting. Bob said we can get the spreadsheet from Pam and Jim agreed to do that.

Facilities & Maintenance Income & Expenses: Bob reviewed the Facilities & Maintenance account which was prepared for the Finance Council and is attached to these minutes.

Weekly Accounts Report: Bob briefly reviewed the balances left in the Parish main accounts that was prepared for the Finance Council and they are attached to these minutes.

Roofing and Flooring Projects: Bob said the roofer is planning to work on the recent two leaks following heavy rains and wind. This needs to be completed before the final restitution for the roof is paid. We thought everything was resolved and were planning to withhold \$15,000 leaving the final payment of \$20,000. Now we have to finalize everything once again. We do have a 5-year warrantee on workmanship instead of the original one year.

The encapsulation of the floor of the Boogaard Hall has been completed and was an excellent job.

Diocesan Annual Appeal: Bob and Pam are checking on access to the Diocesan summary information to see where OLBS stands on collections to-date.

Elections: There is no progress on asking additional parishioners to serve on Parish Council.

Cemetery Committee: Cremation and Columbariums: We have received additional surveys and need to include them in the summary of the survey. Perhaps a presentation can be made in September.

Fostering Program: Tiffany mentioned information has been sent to Council and that she had been contacted from someone who wanted to make a fostering presentation at the church.

Need for ministers and other volunteer positions in Parish: We need to continue requesting help and include the personal approach to get parishioners to step up and volunteer.

Blood Drive: The Knights of Columbus held their blood drive at the Boogaard Hall July 14th with a reduced number of donors. Ten pints were collected and a half dozen people were turned away because of low iron, etc. It is thought that the previous two drives being cancelled by the Red Cross because of lack of personnel interrupted our regular donors and will take a while to get back to normal. The next blood drive is in October.

August 20 breakfast & Father Oscar's 42 Anniversary of Ordination: The Knights are planning to cook the breakfast.

Parish Picnic: Tiffany said a meeting is planned in a couple weeks to work on a Parish picnic which would take place in mid-September, perhaps the 10th or 17th. She will be back in touch with Council about meeting after a Mass. She would like to know who would be interested in heading up committees for various duties at the picnic.

Sound System in the church & choir area: It was noted that the electrical and sound system needs a complete overhaul.

Parish International Dinner: A Parish International Dinner may be held in mid-October with some of the funds going to the cultural gardens planned behind the Boogaard Hall and some going to Mason Kopacki's Eagle Scout project, the outdoor Stations of the Cross behind the parking lot and church.

Next meeting date will be August 27th at 10:15 am.

Closing Prayer: Father Oscar led the closing prayer.
