

What is a Soul?

In Sacred Scripture the term "soul" often refers to human life or the entire human person. But "soul" also refers to the innermost aspect of man, that which is of greatest value in him, that by which he is most especially in God's image: "soul" signifies the spiritual principle in man. The human body share in the dignity of "the image of God": it is a human body precisely because it is animated by a spiritual soul, and it is the whole human person that is intended to become, in the body of Christ, a temple of the Spirit. (CCC 363-364)

The church teaches that every spiritual soul is created immediately by God- it is not "produced" by the parents- and also that it is immortal: it does not perish when it separates from the body at death, and it will be reunited with the body at the final Resurrection. (CCC 366).

This year is a National Eucharistic Revival movement for all parishes. This is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Fact on the Eucharist- Ever wonder the meaning of the "JHS" found on the Eucharist?

"JHS" on the Eucharist stands for **Jesus Hominum Salvator** in Latin, which means **Jesus Savior of Mankind** It is considered as a monogram of the name of Jesus Christ, also known as Christograms, and is found inscribed on Holy Eucharist or Holy Host². In the Latin-speaking Christianity of medieval Western Europe, the most common Christogram became "IHS" or "IHC", denoting the first three letters of the Greek name of Jesus, IH Σ OY Σ , iota-eta-sigma, or IH Σ ³.

Meditation:

Do not be surprised that you are sometimes unjustly accused. I Myself first drank this cup of undeserved suffering for love of you (Diary, 289).

1934, Holy Thursday. Jesus said to me, I desire that you make an offering of yourself for sinners and especially for those souls who have lost hope in God's mercy (Diary, 308)

My Prayer Response:

Jesus, by the merits of Your undeserved sufferings for us, help those who are unjustly accused and suffering without hope. Give them courage, Lord to endure their sufferings out of love for You and souls.

Priests for Life
